



# REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT By Jim Abram =

t might not officially be fall for another eleven days, but it sure feels like it outside. The air and the light seem to change and our bodies seem to sense the change. Thoughts of firewood, gutter cleaning and anti-freeze in my truck seem to prevail. Oh well, it was a great summer, once it got going in July! So here we go again into "meeting season"! It was busy during the summer but now it gets crazy, with most days booked at one meeting or another. I have to admit, I love it because it means I can get things done for our area. No more frustration of calling government officials and hearing that they are on holiday and having to put off getting something finished for our area. Most people are coming back to work in the next week or so and we will be back at it full throttle.

#### Fall Fair

I would like to congratulate the more than 200 volunteers, the organizers, the vendors, the performers and the public for making this second annual event so incredibly wonderful! We were so lucky to have the rain hold off until the last minutes of the fair.

Everyone seemed to be having such a good time and there was something for everyone. We have such a variety of talent of all sorts on the island and the fair was a good place to show it off.

It was wonderful to be there with my kids and grandkids. I am sure preparations are already underway for next year's event! Once again a special thanks to the organizers!

#### Quadrapalooza

I am extremely pleased that the "younger crowd" on the island pulled together an amazing two day event of music and festivities. It seemed like it came together quite quickly and gathered momentum at an amazing pace. These are the kinds of events that need to happen to help keep younger people on the islands and participating in our community.

It was a family event and provided a venue for the so many talented musicians and performers to show what they can do. A good time was had by all and plans are underway for another event which will take place next year as I understand. Congratulations to all of the dedicated organizers and performers.

#### Golf Course Grand Opening

What an incredible new asset we now have on Quadra! I attended the grand opening on Sept. 1st and had a chance to have a look around and witness the ribbon cutting.

An incredibly professional job has been done by a dedicated and tenacious group of volunteers and trades people. It is hard to believe that they pulled this off. It took many years of hard work and fundraising and it has paid off. Once again congratulations are in order to the generous people who put so much of their time and effort and money into this endeavour. This course will undoubtedly add recreational opportunities to the island, create jobs, attract tourism dollars and provide spin off dollars to other businesses. I know that there were a lot of

fears about how this golf course idea would negatively impact the island in the beginning, but I am hopeful that those fears have been allayed now that everyone can see what is actually on the ground.

#### Meeting with the Ministry of Highways

I asked for (and received) a meeting with the Area Supervisor of Highways to discuss the issues that have been brought to my attention over the past months. We had a very good meeting over coffee at the HBI a couple of weeks ago. We went over topics such as the bike path that people on the island have been asking for and discussed the most important areas to get working on this.

While West Road would be the easiest to deal with, Heriot Bay Road from around Rebecca Spit Rd. to Heriot Bay seems like the more dangerous stretch and will be looked at for feasibility.

The schedule of paving and pot hole repair was talked about at length and our needs were conveyed to her for all areas of the island. We need a lot of work done and she is now very aware of the worst sections. For the outer islanders, we have agreed to have a meeting with the top officials at Highways and community representatives at the end of Surge Narrows Road in the very near future, to discuss improvements to the last portion of the road to improve access and make it safer.

We also agreed to re-open the discussion on Kanish View Drive and its long history of neglect and how we might resolve it. We also discussed dust control on Valdes Road for the present and future. Lastly, we discussed the issue of snow removal in the winter and the provision of more sand and salt on the roads at crucial times. We now have a very responsive Area Manager and this is a real treat for me, since she is actually interested in our area and will do what she can to help us improve the situation for the island. (I shouldn't say that too loudly.. they might take her away since she is doing too good of a job!.. the cynic in me!)

#### Quathiaski Cove Sewer

There was a letter to the editor placed in our local media with some information that needs correcting and clarifying. I am not going to get into a backand-forth with the author. I have asked our senior staff to respond to the letter and do it publicly in the local media. So, look for their response, either elsewhere in this edition or in the next one.

#### **Upcoming!**

We have our Committee meetings this week, Board meeting next week along with the Solid Waste Board meeting next week and the Hospital Board meeting next week as well. I will then be attending the annual Union of BC Municipalities meeting in Victoria, from Sept. 23rd through Sept. 29th. That will be a long and busy week. I will be meeting with the BC Ferries Commissioner along with 13 other chairs of regional districts and the Islands Trust, on Monday the 24th from 11am until 4pm (a one hour premeeting and one hour postmeeting are included in that).

So that is about it for now. I hope to bring you news on Telus issues, wharf divestiture by the Feds in the outer islands and our Local Area Plan for Quathiaski Cove (we are very close!) in my next report.

# **History of the Tyee Club**

For more than 120 years sports fishermen from all over the world have made their way to the shores of Discovery Passage, near the mouth of the Campbell River, to fish for tyee salmon. When the Tyee Club was formed in 1925, its 5 founding directors included 1 from Vancouver, 2 from the United States, and the Governor of Bermuda. The club's international membership says much about the reputation of the waters that spawned the organization. The Museum at Campbell River will host a fascinating talk on the 'History of the Tyee Club' on Sunday, September 23, from 1 pm to 2:30 pm.

Veteran rower Norm Lee, who has 35 seasons of rowing experience, will deliver the talk based on the photographs currently being shown in the exhibit 'Fishing Old School, the Tyee Club of British Columbia' at the Museum.

To qualify for membership in the Tyee Club, fishermen must land, from a rowboat, a spring salmon weighing not less than 30 lbs. using regulation tackle. Tackle specifications include line with a 25 lb. breaking weight and an artificial lure equipped with a single hook. Today these hooks are barbless. Want to hear more? Come out to the Museum on September 23 and discover a unique aspect of Campbell River's history! The cost for the talk is \$6.00. Call the Museum at 287-3103 to reserve a seat.

hickens. It was a whole new world. We got Betty and Boop from a neighbouring island and brought the girls home to weed the garden. They cluck and trill and scratch and poop. They bathe in the dust and nest in the coop.

Oh, the reciprocity: I keep them healthy and safe, they peck and scratch away unwanted greenery. An egg now and then was supposed to be a welcome bonus.

When I found four eggs in four days, I felt the universe smiling on me...and then it made me squirm.

I hadn't expected mixed feelings. I wanted to be ecstatic, proudly self-sustaining, congratulating myself on this healthy lifestyle choice - all part of "knowing where my food comes from."

But my grew-up-on-a-farm husband had seen it coming. "I knew you'd be like this," he rolled his eves and shook his head. "Just scramble them. Do it. Eat them."

I'm not a farmer. I'm a vegetarian, an overly-sensitive one. One who cares that food animals have a good life before they become food, who makes a point of buying eggs laid by free-range chickens.

But it was a whole lot easier when I didn't know the hens.

These eggs, from what were now my chickens, suddenly, this was, well... personal!

I hovered and fussed in the kitchen. Time flew out the brunch window. I was genuinely hungry. Still, I hesitated.

I picked some berries.

I washed the floor.

I read a magazine.

I brushed the cat.

I put in a load of laundry.

I checked email.

I took every opportunity to avoid breaking those eggs.

"Just get it over with," my husband coached. "I'm telling you: scramble them.

With. The. Whisk."

It sounded so violent.

I'm supposed to just get cracking? Just like that? Totally blasé? Single-handedly, a la Julia Child...Then whip them into...Something in me objected. Betty and Boop took a lot of time and energy to make those eggs.

Up to this point, I'd always had pets. Animals I love and care for. Animals I take to the vet to vaccinate and "get fixed." I send pictures of them to my friends....

With the arrival of the chickens and the eggs, I realized, this was a whole new kind of human-animal relationship, one I wasn't prepared for, and I wasn't completely comfortable with it.

It hit me - hard: these are working animals. I am using them – for food.

Betty and Boop are red and black. They're pretty - for chickens. I tend them with food and water, close the door to their coop at night and let them out each morning. I check the fence around the garden. It makes me smile when I hear their contented warbling. I worry about them when they squawk. And now, I have a whole new level of respect for the concept of keeping chickens.

I did eventually steel myself and break two eggs to make an omelet, with garlic and basil from my garden.

For once, I didn't burn my meal.

For once, I ate slowly, carefully, truly tasting each mouthful, with reverence.

I savoured my new reality, grateful that it had hit home.

## Fatal Vehicle Crash

On September 2, 2012 at 2:48 PM the Quadra Island RCMP, Cortes Island Volunteer Fire Department and British Columbia Ambulance Service were advised of a single vehicle collision on Gorge Harbour Road on Cortes Island. The vehicle, which had gone off the road and down an embakment, was fully engulfed in flames upon the arrival of emergency services. The lone male occupant and two dogs were found deceased inside the burned out vehicle. The deceased is a 78 year old Cortes Island resident. The crash is being investigated by Quadra Island RCMP, Campbell River RCMP Traffic Services and the British Columbia Coroner's Service. 

# Save The Heart Of Quadra **Parks Final Fundraiser**

Save the Heart of Quadra Island is on the home stretch of a decade-long campaign to save the heart of Quadra's spectacular marine parks by purchasing the vital lands between Octopus Island and Small Inlet Provincial Parks.

In May, the provincial government signed the purchase agreement with the owner and secured the majority of the funds needed. Save the Heart of Quadra Parks spent the summer mobilizing the community to raise part of the outstanding amount.

# Polio Ashram, India

This year I visited the ashram in August because my daughter wanted to go at that time.

Kind people on Quadra, Cortes and Read had donated \$6862 to the Arya Sugandh Sansthan Ashram (True Fragrance ashram) for children with physical disabilities -actually also for orphans and for destitute children -no child is ever turned away.

There are 103 children there, and about 900 children attend the school on the ashram grounds.

The money raised was used to build a biogas plant (so the 24 non-milking cattle are somewhat useful) - see the photo of dal cooking on the methane stove -piped from the underground plant. Also the money went for fruit and extra milk 1-2 a week for the children in 2013, and banisters for the school stairs and it included \$100 for a special meal for the children (with puris and ladoos) and \$100 (kindly donated by one of you) for individual boxes of Indian candies for the children.

Now, I would like to raise money for solar power for lights (homework in the evenings!) and fans; whilst we were there there were constant power outages and it was very hot. Also, money is needed for safety railings for the second floor classrooms.

I will be at the last Farmers' market, the QCC Winter markets and once a month at Manson's Friday market on Cortes. I have bags, cards and bookmarks that the children have made, plus plants and "treasures" kindly donated.

# **Stephen Hume Comes To Quadra**

In 1989, he abandoned the executive suite and returned to the West Coast and writing. He has been senior writer and columnist at The Vancouver Sun for 23 years. In addition to his staff duties for The Vancouver Sun, he teaches writing to graduate and undergraduate students at the University of Victoria.



# In Tribute of Judy Leicester

Judy Leicester (March 26, 1947 - September 8, 2012)

will be forever appreciated by everyone who enjoys the beauty of Quadra's wilderness parks. Her untimely passing leaves islanders mourning, but also remembering Judy's amazing presence and her legacy of community service and conservation achievements. Our hearts go out to her husband Richard, and to all her family and friends who are grieving.

Judy was an amazing, committed and creative person with unparalleled dedication to conserving and sharing Quadra's natural places. She was a founding member in 1989 of the Village Bay Lakes Park Committee, a small group that endeavoured more than 7 years to achieve protection of 5000 hectares of Class A provincial parks on Quadra and Read Island in 1996. Judy would be the first to say teamwork created these incredible parks, and she's right. But it was Judy who later navigated the steady course through a maze of political obstacles necessary to procure many of the privately owned "inholdings" within these parks.

Judy appreciated wilderness everywhere and put her values to work at home. In the 1980s and '90's she was a member of the Quadra Island Forest Resources Committee, a group made up of environmentalists, loggers and Ministry of Forests personnel, aiming for consensus on an ecologically responsible way to use Quadra's forestland. When the QIFRC dissolved and BC's Forest Act was changed to make direct supervision of logging practices more difficult, Judy continued to represent Quadra Island



conservation interests through ForestWatch BC and to liaison with the local forest industry.

Along with Richard, Judy was a long-time member of the Quadra Island Trails Committee, and she worked tirelessly on identifying, planning, building and maintaining about 250 km of recreational trails for public enjoyment. She and Richard hosted the trail committee meetings at their house and Judy always provided one of her delicious desserts to go with the tea and coffee. She was the main organizer of the work parties, often the crew boss, and certainly the quality control officer - she made sure those pesky salal branches were trimmed low and tossed completely off the trail! Judy was justifiably proud of Quadra's beautiful trails and glad that trails and parks serve the local economy.

Judy was a founding member of Sierra Quadra and served as the Conservation Chair. Her efforts have been diligent and determined. Judy was instrumental in organizing many local events, including Sierra Quadra presentations and the annual Quadra Island Beach Clean-up. One of Judy's many strengths was her ability to deal with government officials and industry workers. She was always on the phone to them: getting materials for the trails, coordinating work with TimberWest, getting Parks rangers to actually visit our parks. She was a fearless, persistent and effective advocate for Quadra Island.

The project that most exemplifies Judy's endeavours is "Save the Heart of Quadra Parks", a final, concerted effort to acquire 395 hectares of the historic portage route and forested trail to Newton Lake so as to connect and complete the two existing provincial parks at Small Inlet and Wyatt Bay. Over the last 16 years, even when almost everyone else had given up, she kept up the pressure on both the government and the land owner to come to an agreement on the private lands within the original park boundaries. She never lost hope and today it seems likely we are finally going to see the completion of her dream. It is truly sad to think that Judy will not be here to celebrate a victory for which she, more than anyone else, deserves the credit.

Judy was Quadra's most informed and politically savvy environmentalist. Her gentle persistence, quiet passion, calm demeanour and kindness will be sorely missed by all who had the pleasure of knowing her. Others will only know that someone very special helped preserve a beautiful part of the world for everyone else to love.
