

More Park's on Quadra - Ridiculous

Phil Stone's proposal for yet another Quadra Island park is ridiculous!

Q.Is has a far greater percentage of parks than most other islands or jurisdictions.

Many people do not realize that creation of a park generally entails zero resource extraction. No mushroom or berry picking, no firewood cutting, no hunting and of course no logging.

A few minimum wage jobs may be gained, but likely they exist already. The longterm, fulltime highly paid forestry jobs would be reduced.

When Main L:ake Park was created, all parties, including the Quadra loggers, agreed that the viewshed of the Village Bay Lakes would be in a park. This sacrificed a large area of TFL 47 that would no longer be available for logging.

When the main advocates of the park, including Judy Leicester, met with the thenminister, Moe Sihota of the NDP, they decided, with the strike of a pen, to also include the nonagreed-upon large area around Stramberg Lake as well - no viewshed there, or access either, even for kayaks. With the recent purchase (almost \$6 million) of Merrile and Ring lands on the north end of QIs. we have massive acreages of parkland designated. If this latest proposal is made a park, how long until still more will be added?

In response to Mr Stone; there are no 'clearcuts' currently on Quadra Island, only small patch cuts, the largest of which are 2 tree-lengths in all directions from the centre of the block. No old-growth timber is currently logged on the portion of Quadra reachable by road. All of the proposed park area that was loggable has previously been

harvested; ie: it's 2nd growth. The much ballyhooed trails in this area are mostly old logging roads from the old days.

Low intensity logging, with small patch cuts needs a large land base to be sustainable, as it currently is on Quadra.

Timber provides the greenest possible building material; QIs soil is best suited to growing coniferous trees. Dual usage, as practiced today, allows for all activities. Logging the area doesn't change the topography. Rock climbing, mountain biking, hiking, mushroom picking, firewood gathering and hunting are mostly unchanged or enhanced. Lakesides and mountaintops are completely unchanged; views can even be improved. The idea that a patch cut, which is planted and soon greens up, is forever ugly can easily be disproved by observing the greenup along West Road and on Walcan Road.

Another benefit of sustainable forestry is the improvement of sick forests by harvesting and replanting. Observe the dead and dying trees along the trails in Belnkin Park and in the Morte Lake Conservancy land. A very lage portion of these pieces of forest will not exist in 20 - 50 years. The root rot is extensive, and with no remedial forestry, will destroy the trees and the will fall down. Old growth forests were rarely the envisioned row upon row of lovely trees. The prime "old growth" forest of the CampbelL River are of Vancouver Island was generally only about 350 years old, due to forest fires, thus their high quality.

The choice is thus multi-use of a healthy forest with low-intensity forest harvesting or limited recreational useage only of a declining forest resource that eliminates a number of well-paid jobs.

Thank you Mr Liseth,

for sharing your views on a proposed regional park at Morte Lake & Mt Seymour, and forestry in general on Quadra Island.

As "ridiculous" as the idea may sound it is no more unreasonable than clinging to an out-dated sense of nostalgia in the face of rapidly changing economics, demographics & unchecked corporate hegemony.

I think sir, you greatly underestimate the economic value that tourism and parks have on Quadra.

It is baseless rhetoric to say that tourism and recreation only create minimum wage jobs. The characterization that those are the only services a visitor needs is... well, ridiculous. Every business on our island relies, even depends, on tourism. My friends and neighbours in the forestry industry have my utmost respect, but I'd venture our community today could survive the absence of TimberWest and TFL 47 far better than it could the absence of tourism. That's to say nothing of the options for more woodlots, a community forest & value-added processing we'd have if Quadra was removed from the TFL entirely.

Anyway, since when did one person's right to work trump another's? Equality & balance are called for, not one industry operating to the detriment of all else.

'Parks' is the number one internet search term visitors to BC use to plan their destination, so given that I don't think we could ever have too much parkland.

Our environment and recreation opportunities are also a key attraction for people moving to our community. Ask around - you'll find there are computer-programmers, scientists and a whole range of professionals, young families and retirees that have relocated to the island because of the lifestyle here. Parks are not just about tourism, they're about our community's future.

With little space left I'll just say, yes, a *regional* park would curtail logging, but it could still provide all the other opportunities you list.



SANDRA'S SWAN SONG

It was lovely to be honoured at May Day for the work I have done at the community centre the last 30 years. I have been told that new people to the island have no idea the story of the community centre and that I should tell it. Well, I started a great long saga in my journal of which Beowulf would be proud. However in this era of 40 character twitter feeds, Beowulf is out. So rather than go into the scrumptious details of who did what and why and who was left standing, I'll give a précis and maybe think of a way all who were involved could add to the story on the Rec website sometime in my lazy retirement.

From my perspective, how it all started was when a whole generation of baby boomers saw the 1972 oil crisis on t.v. and people were walking on freeways in Europe because they had no gas. The "back to the land" movement popped the twenty somethings out of the cities to find a better alternative to oil dependance. (Gee, that worked well.) So Quadra was invaded by wild eyed idealists who ten years later were settled in half finished houses with babies in tow. A need for a public building for recreation grew. Alchemy occurred when Carol Harling-Bleeks returned from UBC with knowledge of grants and a 'how to' of community development. That mixed with entrepreneur, John Fell's "go for it" spirit and Rod Clark, Mich Hirano, Jim Mathias and Barry Hodgeson's commitment and expertise. The building committee was born and three years later the community centre, although unfinished was brought to lock up and opened to the public in June 1985.



Now in my Beowulf edition, I would call the next chapter, "Never trust "the starters" 'cuz they will leave you with years of work" but I digress. Joan Blackmer and I were on the new board assembled to finish and operate the facility and we were on the phone every night dealing with details no volunteers should ever have to contend with. It was a time in which the daycare was the first tenant and the daycare coordinator, Carol Foort had to pack up the toys after the last parent left with their kid, so the space was free for evening rentals. To add to the dysfunction, the cement floor which was untiled, was impossible to keep clean. Our fundraising was dances and coffee houses which are exhausting to organize. Soon we got on to government gaming and trekked to the Bingo Palace in Campbell River and brought home bags of cigarette smoke drenched cash. It is exhilarating to count piles of cash but I've never been able to reconcile the incongruence of funding recreation by preying on bingo players. In 1991 our bingo funding was threatened and we decided to take the community centre to referendum to get on the tax rolls. The population voted 64% to fund the community centre and we were then free to get on with doing recreation instead fundraising.

An underlying pressure which dogged us from the beginning was the need for more space for performers. The office acted as the dressing room when events happened on the stage. There's nothing like coming to work on Monday morning to find make up ground into the desk top. It took 12 years for phase two, "the addition" to gestate and then complete which required a whole new set of leaders to instigate, fundraise, plan and then build. I have a deep respect for the process of grass roots community development and the heroes it spawns. Val Barr, David Smith, Hilary Stewart, Nancy Allwarden, Nancy McDonald, Carol Woods, Joan Blackmer, Hilda Van Orden, Robin Mawhinney, George Murdock, Rob Simpson, Paul Ryan, Tanya Storr, Bob Griswold, Murray Johnson, Brett Johnson and many others put their energies into the project.

But the community centre is more than the building. The baseball fields have a whole story of their own, with John Gregg, Willy DuBois, Ross McPhee and Ross Doak and many others taking the lead in their time. The skatepark has Lois Taylor and Sharon Brereton instigating a whole other crew of volunteers from inception to completion. Terryl Bertagnolli led the charge on the bike jumps with a crew of young men in tow. The tennis courts has a story told by Rod Clark, Don Doolittle, Mich Hirano, Michael Mascall and others. David Smith was instrumental in developing the equestrian ring and much more. The concept of trails was initiated by Hilda Van Orden, Marcy Wolters, Noel Lax and rounded out and completed by dynamo, Judy Leicester and crew.

And then, of course we have all the programming that has taken place the past 30 years and the events and functions which bring a community centre to life from generations of parent and tots to the fabulous Fall Fair and everything in between. We have always welcomed new arrivals to the island to get involved because we need new infusions of energy, so if you are a newbie reading this, please feel welcome to come to the QCC office and introduce yourself to the wonderful young coordinator there, Rebecca Young who will love to get you on a new journey of grass roots involvement! We need your different perspectives too.

Ok, this is all from the old guard for now. See you at the QCC 30th Anniversary potluck on Friday, June 26. Bring your love and laughter and let's celebrate our good fortune to live in this community. Oh ya, and if we didn't have those "starters" I would never have had a job, so thanks Carol.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Family Evacuation Plan Part 1

Although we all hope it will never be necessary, there may come a time when part or even the whole island may need to be evacuated. If your neighbourhood has an NEPP (Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness Plan), you are well on the way to being ready for an evacuation. If your area of the island is not yet organised, perhaps it is time to think about developing your own NEPP. Contact Judy Hagen (285 2150) for further details.

There are two levels to an evacuation. First an Evacuation ALERT is issued – a warning about an imminent threat to life and property in a defined area, and people in that area should prepare to leave on a moment's notice. The second is an ORDER to evacuate, and people should leave the area immediately.

You may receive the information re ALERT or an ORDER to evacuate by First Responders knocking on your door and telling you to leave right away or saying you have less than 30 minutes to leave. The First Responders may be from the Fire Department, Police or Search and Rescue. You can also find out about the possibility of an evacuation from the following media sources:

Radio: 99.7 FM, 89.5 Cortes Island Radio, 98.9GOAT, 97.3 Eagle FM, 88.7 Spirit FM

Television: CHEK Channel 6, and, if a large emergency, Global BC and CBC.

As radio reception is not great on many parts of the island, it would be advisable to check your reception of those various stations to find what works for your home.

If you have already prepared a Grab and Go bag, you are well organised for an evacuation. It is better to have a bag for each member of the family, rather than one big bag as you may have to walk some distance. Locate all family members to inform them what is happening. Remind them of a meeting place agreed on ahead of time or a common phone contact off island. You may want to consider moving any disabled person or children to a safe area ahead of the actual evacuation. Small pets can be taken with you in your vehicle but moving livestock will require more thought and advanced preparation. Emergency accommodation or group lodging will be provided if required. Monitoring news outlets will let you know if there will be a Reception Centre opened and where it will be. You are encouraged to register with the local ESS Emergency Reception Centre that will be established once a location is deemed safe. This will ensure you can be contacted and/ or reunited with your family and loved ones. DO NOT ASSUME THE RECEPTION CENTRE WILL BE THE COMMUNITY CENTRE. It will depend on the emergency.

TOUR CREATIVE SPACES ON CORTES JUNE 20TH, 2015

HAVE YOU BEEN WONDERING??

Curiosity is running high about "the Mushroom Projects" around the lakes. If you rely on a lake system for fresh water you'll want to check out the installation of a myco-filtration system along Gunflint Lake. This simple ecological system utilizes mycelium (mushroom family) inoculated in wood chips and spread strategically where runoff and leaching occurs. Mycelium gobble up phosphates and nitrates that cause algae blooms in lakes. A bonus is harvesting delicious giant mushrooms! Find out all about this great project and have all your questions answered on the Cortes Museum's annual tour of Creative Spaces – Gardens, Studios & Workshops on Saturday, June 20th, 9:30 am to 4:30 pm.

Intimate and spacious; matured and new; landscaped and naturally wild; private and community – it's all on this year's tour of Cortes gardens, studios and workshops.

Creative artists gather at a gallery and invite you into their private home studios. Visit the spacious studio and gallery of a world renowned and award winning photographer who grew up on Cortes. Gardeners and artists will open their garden gates and studio doors to visitors for this popular tour on June 20th. This allows visitors ample time to peruse a variety of Cortes Island's lovely gardens and interesting studios before catching the last ferry off Cortes at 5:50 pm. Tour tickets are \$12 and include a map with addresses and brief descriptions of each venue on the tour. Advance tickets are available on Cortes at the Museum, all stores, and Friday Markets at Manson's Hall. For visitors arriving by ferry, same-day tour tickets will be sold near the top of the hill up from the Cortes ferry dock – look for signs at the corner of Seavista Road – between 9:30 and 10 am.
