Purolator Petition - Lobby for Return of Service

Dear Editor -

You may have been wondering why our post office appears to be overly busy for the summer season. Its as if Christmas has arrived for the postal workers in the month of May rather than December. Again you'll have noticed another change in the arrival and departure of freight from Inspirations, our stationery retailer a few doors down from the Post Office. The answer to both questions can be traced back to January 27th of this year. That was the date that Purolator Canada prematurely canceled their five year contract as the carrier of mail and freight for all communities north of Nanaimo. We the residents on Ouadra have received the brunt of this decision. No other community is more affected than our postal workers and the retailer in the Cove who held the contract with Purolator Canada for the last ten years.

The pundit Mark Twain once observed that the mail must get through. With the freight contract terminated Canada Post had to scramble to find another means to transport our mail north of Nanaimo. You'll never guess what happened next. Purolator discovered in their boardrooms in Toronto that a ferry ride was required to reach the Purolator outlet on Quadra Island. That meant waiting patiently like the rest of us for the ferry to arrive and leave on schedule every hour on the hour. But to a wealthy company like Purolator time is money. They came up with a solution that only a miser could appreciate. Not only did they cancel their contract with Inspirations but they also found they could use the people who run our post office as their unpaid conscripts. Bulk freight that should have arrived a few doors away at Inspirations is now dumped at

the back door of our post office. Perhaps those guys back in one of their towers in Toronto didn't plan it this way. But its almost certain they were fully cognizant that they'd save time and money by ending their contract as the carrier of Canada Post mail out of Nanaimo. Still needing freight transported over to Quadra, Purolator finds it in the new shipper Canada Post has recruited to traverse the perilous waters of Discovery Passage. Unbeknownst to those who expedite large items from Vancouver or Calgary (via Purolator) their shipments are showing up not at a retail outlet as in the rest of Canada but at our post office. Purolator cancels not one but two contracts and saves a bundle at our expense. We lose all semblance of good service and our postal workers get turned in to unpaid swappers. It's disappointing that all of this is happening right here under our noses.

The next indication that Purolator was on its way to another billion in profit came when I had to take a ferry ride over to the laundromat in Campbell River to ship freight via Purolator; and pick up anything heavier than 70 pounds which involves some form of a vehicle. The cost of doing any business with Purolator Canada just got shifted off the company and on to the consumer. It wasn't like this for the last ten years.

I'll try to be reasonable. On a map

in the board room of Purolator headquarters in Toronto, Inspirations on Quadra and the Laundromat in Campbell River would be located under the same pin on a map of Upper and Lower Canada. To a CEO in a board room, the distance their clients have to cover to have items retrieved from a laundromat rather than Inspirations would appear inconsequential. To make the transaction even more attractive, the postal workers on Quadra wouldn't have to be paid an extra penny. Even Donald Trump couldn't figure out a better strategy.

Mark Twain pointed out further that living with suppressed anger can lead to liver cancer so with that in mind I detailed my concerns in a polite email to Purolator's head office. In response, they provided the address to which a Petition could be forwarded for their consideration.

This of course brings up the purpose of my diatribe. As of June 1st, petitions will be posted on the bulletin boards at our gas station, on the ferry, and at the stores in the Cove and Heriot Bay. We need as many people of sober reflection to sign those petitions as possible. Canadians are paying for good transport at all times and can expect the best service possible from Purolator. Please sign the Petition. Gorden

Quadra Island Golf Club Announces Open House



The golf club will host an open house at the Community Hall from 6:00 to 8:00 PM on Monday June 5.

Islanders may now be aware that the golf club has made application to the Regional District to rezone the 150 acre property on Heriot Bay Road.

The purpose of the open house is to clarify the golf club's intentions with this re zoning application.

Although the original plan was to develop a full 18 hole course it is now evident that the club could never afford to go beyond the 9 hole facility which is now well established.

The golf course property is 150 acres and the 9 hole course and support facilities occupy just over half the property, about 85 acres. The club proposes to use the remaining 65 acres to create a "Rural Residential" zone which could accommodate 17 lots in a strata format.

The strata concept allows for considerable acreage to be dedicated to public trails and a dedicated park as well as ensuring control over how the lots are developed.

It is a financial challenge to maintain a beautiful facility. The sale of these lots is foreseen as a means to ensure that the course can continue to provide a first rate recreational facility.

Fresh water, waste water and traffic are as always major concerns for islanders. Experts will be on hand to answer questions.

The club hopes that many will attend. We would like to provide an opportunity for dialogue with the community so that we can understand any concerns that might exist with our neighbours and residents of Quadra.




