Community Gathersing: Sing for Pure Joy!

COME RE-ENCHANT THE WORLD with heart-felt melodies, meditative chants, luscious layered songs, robust rounds, soulful gospel songs and rousing spirituals! Songs from the sublime to the riciculous!

No written music is used. All songs are taught in the traditional method of call and response.

When you sing with a group of people, you learn to subsume yourself into a group consciousness because a cappella singing is all about the immersion of the self into the community. To stop being 'me' for a little while, and to become 'us.' For most of human history people sang together, and it wasn't seen as a competition or a contest; it was a joyful communal experience.

Research shows that people who are involved in choirs are healthier, they live longer and they have fewer depressions. One of the hormones we generate when we sing together is oxytocin. It is a hormone (the feel good hormone!) that makes it possible for us to bond. When you sing in a group, you bond with the people that you are singing with. Group singing is cheaper than therapy, healthier than drinking and certainly more fun that working out!

We will gather at the Quadra Community Centre on Saturday, August 17th from 9 to 4 in Room 3. The cost is \$40. Pre-registration is recommended.

Independent Power Project near Bute Inlet

DEAR ISLANDERS,

In its July 5th edition, the Campbell River Mirror posted an application for a 'Disposition of Crown Land' near the head of Bute Inlet. The application, made by a Turkish numbered company with an office in Vancouver, seeks an Investigative Licence for Waterpower Purposes.

This proposal is a Run-of the-River, Independent Power Project. The area covered by the application is approximately 5000 hectares and includes the Homathko Icefield and two major river systems.

This proposal, similar to the Plutonic Energy IPP a decade ago, would create tremendous environmental damage with water intakes, diversion tunnels, access roads, concrete and steel support towers and miles of electric cable through clearcut right of ways. It would alienate the land for all other uses.

This is a totally inappropriate application for this wildlife rich, spectacular wilderness that could and should qualify as a National Heritage Site. One wonders why this application was ever considered or how it got this far, but it has.

It is our obligation to object. Please send written submissions opposing this application and the project.

REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT JULY 29, 2019

I am not sure how or why this happens to me on each of the days that I am supposed to write my Discovery Islander report. The sun is out and the day is warm and beautiful. And here I sit at my keyboard trying to relay the latest issues of interest! This issue has a few important ones and some of it I cannot even begin to go into in detail due to the complexity. But I will do my best.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

I'll start with an easy one. We have three public Hearings coming up in the next month or so for private docks in various areas. Two are straight-forward and one is somewhat problematic. One is on East Thurlow, one in Deepwater Bay and the last one is in Open Bay. This one has caused some extra work on my part to respond to concerns of neighbours and will be considered on a different date from the other two. When we know the dates, I will post them and they will be advertised by the SRD.

SURGE NARROWS WATER LEASE

I received some very good news early this morning from the Ministry of Forests and Lands that they are about to issue the lease we have been trying to get for more than a year for the SRD dock at Surge Narrows on Read Island. This is adjacent to the existing dock and will be a welcome addition.

It should also be noted that our purchase and subdivision for the upland 6.5 acres of land has finally been approved. It is done! It belongs to the SRD for community benefit. I am very pleased about this as it has been an extremely tedious exercise in bureaucratic dealings and patience! Many people have worked on it, including our dedicated planning and corporate staff and I thank each of them. Thanks to the community for all of the work they have put into the cleanup of the debris on the site, which was required by the Ministry. It was all volunteer work and done expertly! So now we move into development stage as soon as we receive our final paperwork!. One more success story full of collaboration and cooperation.

CELL PHONE COVERAGE DECLINE

I have received many calls and emails from islanders about a decline in service on their cell phones. I am suffering the same decline to the point of rarely being able to talk on my phone in my home at the south end! I called the Vancouver Island Area manager for Telus and have had numerous conversations with

him and he even tested conversations between himself and me using various combinations of phones. He then directed staff to complete an assessment electronically of our system on Quadra and the west side of Read Island. Finding nothing he dispatched two techs to do testing with me (on my phone) on the island in various locations. They determined that we were right and that the coverage was getting worse than before. So his latest step is to dispatch a tech team to climb the tower and try to find the root of the problem. That will happen next week.

I am pleased to have developed a good relationship with this manager and that he is willing to take our concerns as being real and serious. He is actually acting on them in a timely manner. I hope they find the cause and fix it! I don't want this to turn out to be just another "X-Files" situation and be treated as such!

GOWLLAND HARBOUR VIEWS DEVELOPMENT

Okay, I have finished with all of the easier toics to write about and now must take on a couple of the larger files. I have no intention of repeating all of the background info about this proposal. If you need that, please read previous issues of the Discovery Islander. That is where the most inclusive information is contained.. As you have heard, the proposal is continuing to go through the process. It will be a long one, I am sure. What I really want to address are some of the very distressing nonsense rumours that have been surfacing about my involvement and preferences on this file.

It has come to my attention that some actually believe that I am in favour of the proposed water system for this development so that the rest of the developments in the Cove can be serviced. If you thought about it for more than a split second, you would see that is totally absurd. It could not supply the other developments. There is no guarantee that it will even service the proposed development. I have never said it had anything to do with the rest of the Cove nor even alluded to it. Island Health deals with water systems. They have the jurisdiction. Even if they approved the proposed one, no one could afford to bring that water elsewhere.

I have opposed having a water system for Q. Cove over this past year due to the enormous cost of construction and outrageous cost to any land owner / user of the system. I only went along with applying for a grant to find out if it was feasible and what it would

cost to satisfy the demands of Island Health. I don't need, nor do the users, another huge annual operating cost for another "system". The part that bothers me the most is the the fact that the rumour has even started and that anyone would believe that I would do that.

Rumour number two: That I supported giving the developer additional lots for the installation of the water system! This is not only untrue, it is insulting. The only amenity that the developer was offered by staff, as far as I know, was three extra small lots as part of the normal density bonus process that is in our OCP and bylaws, so that they would join the sewer rather than use individual septic fields throughout the development. This was far more environmentally responsible and would allow the entire sewer system to run at a higher efficiency and reduce the annual operating cost to all users of the system. The rumour that the developer was offered cheaper rates on the sewer hookups is absolutely untrue. Everyone pays the same rate and that is that! No deals.

It seems that whenever a development is proposed on this island, there is an assumption by some that there is skullduggery going on with the SRD and the Director is at the lead of it. Everything about this proposal has been done according to the rules. Even though we have an existing OCP, it is meant to be a living document, meaning that it is open to application to change it. The SRD has an obligation through legislation to accept applications. That, in no way, means that the change will be acceptable. But the SRD has a process to follow and the SRD follows it as do I. I was very pleased to see people write Letters to the Editor (Island Forum) in the last DI. It means you are paying attention and that is great! However, comments like "It appears that the SRD, that ought to be guarding the OCP, is guiding developers to submit proposals that would benefit the SRD financially..." are utter uninformed nonsense. I don't mean to offend, but the comment it is so wrong it needs refuting. Same with the "commercial component". There was never a suggestion to put in what is proposed on Goose Bay. Only a few campsites on the Gowlland Harbour side. No marina, clubhouse or cabins. That is the developer, not the SRD.

So in closing on the this topic, I would hope that if you have questions or comments, you would first get the facts from me or the SRD before casting stones. It is hurtful to accuse people of what you suppose the

situation to be without really knowing. Especially when, as your Director, I am doing my best to maintain Quadra's character and keep us viable at the same time. Submit your comments, come to the meetings and the Public Hearing, but please be civil.

CONNECTED COAST INITIATIVE

As you have all heard by now, Gulf Island Cable and a few others have been bought out by Telus. My appreciation goes out to George Barnes and Peter Booth for all of their hard work keeping the system working all this time. I have been working with George for more than a year and more recently with Peter, on getting last mile funding through grants through the SRD. Our staff have done exceptional work in guiding them through the incredible maze that is "government!"

While we were somewhat surprised by this move we were not unaware of the possibility. It does not impact our Connected Coast Initiative at all. We are still moving along rather rapidly and have continuing meetings with government and industry planned in the near future. We have a commitment from Government to connect rural areas and they are helping us do that. And we will do that. Better service at higher speeds and lower costs is what we are aiming for with the project. So stay tuned.

FERRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE WOES (FAC)

I saved the best for last just to see if you were still awake ;-).

We have been having continual back and forth emails and calls with BC Ferries regarding the unilateral, dictatorial approach they are taking with the FAC. At some point the two employees that are in charge of the process decided to "enforce" the limit of two terms on the committee before a person steps down. This has never been an issue before now and is still not an issue on almost all of the other FACs in the province. But suddenly it is here.

Some of the reps from both Quadra and Cortes know exactly why but I am not going to go into that in this forum. So a couple of Quadra reps are being asked to step down and most importantly, our Chair is being asked to relinquish the Chair and step down at the same time in spite of repeated letters from members from both islands to BCFS, right up to the CEO Mark Collins, asking that he remain. Our Chair is Paul Ryan and he has done an excellent job of turning our committee from confrontational to collaborative with BCFS. This is volunteer

like this.

The story is not over. We are being told that the members will be appointed by the BCFS members, and that BCFS will conduct an election of the Chair in confidence, with nominations going to them and votes going to them. No openness nor democracy involved. Most of us are fighting them tooth and nail and will continue until they come to their senses.

This committee has done an incredible job of looking after the needs of the travelling public: Cortes, Quadra and "all of the rest." Yet due to a complaint from one new member, we are now fighting for our rights to choose our representatives and our Chair. I am sure that this short piece will spawn some questions and debate, and so be it. Like I said this is not over
