#### JUST BEFORE THE GOVERNMENT

'FISH WINDOW' – the period allowed for working within salmon streams – closed on September 15, the Quadra Island Salmon Enhancement Society rented a 'rock slinger' from Al & Sons Trucking in Campbell River to place spawning gravel into several streams on Quadra Island.

Targets for throwing included two sites on upper Granite Creek and two at Mud Lake, on upper Hyacinthe Creek. The object of the exercise was to enhance spawning gravel conditions at these sites by augmenting the amounts of gravel present. Several yards were shot at each site using the truck's variable speed conveyor belt. Accurate throwing landed the gravel just where it was needed with the added bonus of not having to hand shovel. Ya gotta love modern technology!

QISES will now monitor the areas this fall to assess the results of the new gravel placement.

# Global Climate Strike on Friday September 20, Spirit Square

**THE CLIMATE CRISIS IN AN EMERGENCY** and governments must be persuaded to act to transition our economies from fossil fuel.

The most recent report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change tells us we have only a few years to make this transition before global temperatures exceed the relative safety

of 1.5 degrees C. Even a 2 degree C difference will bring significantly worse impacts. We are already living with 1 degree of warming.

The effects of climate change have been dramatic and will become much more so. Many of these consequences have been happening considerably sooner than previously predicted. The Arctic permafrost is melting at levels not expected until 2090.

Fires in Siberia have burned 2.6 million hectares of forest this summer and there are thousands of fires in the Amazon. On Greenland 197 billion tones of ice have melted into the North Atlantic in July alone.

Campbell River and the Discovery Islands are not immune. Just a few days ago, pumping began from Lake Cowichan into the river to keep it flowing. There are water shortages on Salt Spring Island where the two main lakes from which freshwater is drawn have dried up. Like Quadra, all Salt Spring's water comes from rain.

We are now experiencing the sixth mass extinction of species with populations of wild animals halved since 1970.

Do we need more proof that we are in the midst of a climate crisis?


Swedish student Greta Thunberg started her own climate strike when she began sitting outside the Swedish Parliament every Friday, trying to raise awareness about the seriousness of the problems the world faces. Her message has ignited student rallies around the world and is the genesis of the Global Climate Strike Sept 20–27 (globalclimatestrike.net).

The Canadian government has not lived up to commitments made to the Paris Climate Agreement and is still subsidizing the fossil fuel industry to the tune of \$3.3 billion annually. It is promoting the completion of the Trans Mountain Pipeline which means an expansion of the Alberta tar sands along with all its other risks. Last year the BC government gave oil and gas companies \$663 million in subsidies. That's \$130 for every person in the province, most of this to promote the fracking of gas with its emissions of methane. Methane is the worst of greenhouse gases, 21 times worse than carbon dioxide.

If this makes you sick at heart or full of anger, join the Global Climate Strike Rally and March in Campbell River at Spirit Square on September 20, 12–2. Have faith that if enough of us demonstrate our fear for our future and that of all living things, we will see governments wake up and begin taking the action needed.

### Friday Flicks Returns September 13 with Woman at War

ICELAND/FRANCE/UKRAINE, 2018,

Icelandic with English subtitles. As a follow-up to his 2013 film Of Horses and Men, director Benedikt Erlingsson delivers the Cannes 18 selection Woman at War, a timely film that speaks to social issues with wit and warmth.

Halla (Halldóra Geirharðsdóttir) is a middle-aged choir director in a small town, popular amongst her neighbors and respected in the community. Unbeknownst to her fellow citizens, she is also an environmentalist vigilante who destroys power lines in an effort to preserve the beautiful local countryside. Deep in the trenches of her anonymous battle against industrialist destruction, Halla depends on the few solitary sources of support in her life: her identical twin sister (also played by Geirharðsdóttir), a co-conspirator (Jorundur Ragnarsson) who keeps her updated on the movements of the government, and a mysterious local farmer (Jóhann Sigurðarson). Just as Halla begins to ramp up her anti-industrial campaign efforts, she receives entirely unexpected news: an application she made years ago to adopt a child from Ukraine has finally been approved, and she's about to become a mother.



### Meet Mark De Bruijn, Green MP Candidate







### LOCAL HISTORY IN THE MAKING

### The Walker Family Erects a Headstone at the Heriot Bay Road Cemetery

#### JOY (WALKER) HUNTLEY AND HER DAUGHTERS Annie

Rousseau, Lorraine Huntley, Kluane Bickerton and Irene Huntley gathered around a newly placed headstone at the Heriot Bay Road Cemetery last week to honour former residents Robert and Dora Walker.

Robert Walker and his first wife, Agnes, came to Quadra in 1893 as Methodist missionaries, at the request of Billy Assu, who wanted a school for the We Wai Kai children. The Walkers remained at the mission until 1904, when they bought a homestead in Gowlland Harbour, which they named Homewood after Walker's childhood farm in Ontario. A few years after his

first wife died in 1915, Walker married again: Dora Spencer, an English immigrant teaching at one of the island's schools. They continued to farm Homewood until the mid 1950s, when age and illhealth forced them to join a daughter in the Okanagan.

Though Robert and Dora Walker died and were buried off-island. when descendants learned a few years ago they owned an unused plot in the Quadra Cemetery they decided to erect a headstone in their memory. It was etched by

granddaughter Kluane Bickerton using Vancouver Island marble, through her company Sandscript Designs.

Joy Huntley looked on proudly as her daughter Irene Huntley read from a piece she wrote about her grandparents' lives. Both

were community leaders, he as a rural judge and school trustee, and she as a social convener, bringing isolated women and children together. Robert Walker lived to the age of 95, passing on his longevity genes to many of his children, including Joy Huntley, who is now 98. She still has her youthful spunk, humour and charm, and lively memories about growing up on Quadra Island in the 1920s – fending off free-ranging cows that commandeered the island's dirt roads on her daily walk to Heriot Bay School. Joy was the only one of Robert Walker's six children (from both marriages) to remain on Quadra after marrying. She and her husband Don Huntley raised their children here and built Seascape Resort in Gowlland Harbour. Though no descendants now live on the island, it continues to hold a treasured place in their memories.

Irene Huntley's tribute to the Walkers will be placed in the Museum at Campbell River Archives, joining a wealth of material written by various family members over the years. - Jeanette Taylor



### QUADRA SALMON ENHANCEMENT

### What To Do When There is Too Much Wood

THIRTY YEARS AGO, salmon stream philosophy was 'a clean stream is a healthy stream'. To that end countless projects during that day focused on removing much of the wood and debris from many salmon rearing streams. Today, current science says the opposite. Trees in the streams provide valuable shelter, shade and insect feed for both spawning and rearing fish of all types. However, there are times where even today there can be too much wood in a stream.

2018 before works began – trees and debris littering the stream with widespread silt accumulations

Drew Creek, here on Quadra Island, was a case in point. In the lower reaches of the stream, adjacent to Heriot Bay Road, many trees from the surrounding mature forest had fallen both in and across the creek. While it wasn't necessarily a bad thing, the trees and their limbs that protruded into the water began to collect small woody debris that flowed

through annually during the winter high water events. This accumulating debris slowed the stream flows, and sediments that were also flowing through the area began to collect. The sediments choked the spawning bed gravels in the area where a hundred or more chum salmon like to spawn each year. Salmon gravels need to be clean in order for water to flow through freely and transport oxygen to the incubating eggs.

REALIZING THE SALMON IMPACTS that were occurring in the stream, the Quadra Island Salmon Enhancement Society – with the assistance of several additional local volunteers – have spent portions of the last two summers removing the surplus wood and helping to restore the gravel conditions.

In July 2018 a crew of volunteers began the clean up the stream by removing the accumulated small

woody debris and stockpiling it all away from the creek and above

the high flow levels.

In July 2019 the main works were carried out. To begin, 10 yards of cleaned spawning gravel were 'high-lined' from a nearby elevated bank into the upper reach of the creek's work area, above where the sediments had collected. These gravels were then spread using an excavator.

The new gravel will not only provide initial increased spawning

opportunities further up the stream from the silted-in beds, but will also gradually migrate with the winter freshets down into the other spawning sites.

#### **NEXT, ROTTEN AND SURPLUS TREES**

were dragged from the creek utilizing a large logging skidder winch placed adjacent to the creek again above the high water mark. Some of the existing trees plus additional wood brought to the site were placed in the creek, forming strategically positioned structures that will encourage streambed scour and sediment removal. This work was again done largely with the skidder, winch and blocks.

Additionally, over a dozen root balls were placed in the stream in conjunction with the logs. These will assist in streambed scour and as well provide fish cover. The trees and roots were then bound together with cable and anchored to instream rocks to keep the structures in place during the winter high water periods.

The final touches to the project this fall will be interpretative signage along the west side of the creek on an enhanced trail system.

As with any project of this nature ongoing monitoring, adjusting and maintenance will be carried out by QISES volunteers to help maximize long term benefits to the creek and the fish that use it.

The lower portion of Drew Creek is located on a portion of the We Wai Kai Reserve # 6. QISES would like to thank the First Nation for their support throughout the project and look forward to further partnerships on the creek in the coming

years. Funding for the project came from the Campbell River Salmon Foundation and the Pacific Salmon Foundation.




