

### Letter from a Concerned Quadra Island Parent:

haring this with the Quadra Island community – just thought you might be interested. The situation needs some attention. This is my personal opinion, but if anything I say here stirs you I encourage you to write a letter as well and add your voice. #### IT IS WITH GREAT OPTIMISM

that I write you this letter. As any parent, I hope that my child will have many enriching, engaging, and quality learning opportunities during their school career. Our preschool provider (Quadra Children's Centre) was extraordinary! Their commitment never wavered from providing the highest quality childcare and learning opportunities, despite shoestring budgets and a small population base from which to draw. I am certain that this was because of extraordinary leadership and a clear vision of quality care and education for the families they served. I came to cherish the excited stories of exploration, wonder, and friendship that my children would tell me about as a result of their time spent there.

My experience with Quadra Elementary School has been an eye opener. My children no longer tell me stories about the things they learned, because they aren't learning due to the composition of the classes and the systematic removal of resources. Too large, too mixed in ability, too short on resources. Teachers are being asked daily to work miracles with nothing. Due to Quadra's demographic

diversity, unsurprisingly, they are not able to make these miracles happen. The children are suffering, as are the parents.

Nearly 25% of
Quadra Elementary
School's students
currently receive
tutorship outside
the school.
Anything wrong with
this picture?

To see how this is impacting our children you need not look far. Approximately one third of the school's parents showed up on a Sunday to express their many concerns regarding their children's learning environments and outcomes.

Close to one quarter of the school's children are receiving tutorship outside of school at extra personal cost to parents. I am one of them. This is why my children do read. This is absurd as I pay taxes for school and an education is part of my child's Charter of Rights. (What of those who cannot afford to pay?!?!)

Many children are struggling to read effectively, if at all, even in the higher grades. Many children are behind in math skills. Many classrooms have multiple teachers and the results are inconsistencies, increased challenges for the children to develop relationships with students and parents, and disruptions in learning.

There are no resources to deal with interpersonal issues which are integral to children's sense of self worth. Bullying that occurs anonymously in a crowded classroom still happens and can be devastating to a child's learning, their sense of self, and to society.

Quadra stands 918 out of 982 in rankings by the Simon Fraser Institute (That's 3.4 out of 10).

THE TEACHERS AND STAFF at Quadra Elementary need more support, and they need leadership with vision. Quality education is a right. I understand that school districts across the province are struggling. I feel that Quadra Elementary is unique because of its rural and isolated setting. Unlike districts such as Campbell River, Courtenay and Nanaimo we have no choice in where our kids attend school. Quadra Elementary is the only school serving a diverse and challenging community. There is limited access to extra curricular enrichment opportunities that may be found in non-island communities. This is significant, because the opportunities that island children get are often restricted to that which they receive at school and no more.

#### I HOPE THAT I HAVE NOT

misplaced my optimism. Please read this knowing that many share this view. Most of all please hear this: these kids, our kids, and all kids know little of our grown up world and the struggles it contains. They deserve for us adults to work together and fix this.

## Claire Trevena calls for improved communications for North Island

mprovements in communications are vital for the economic and social health of our communities as well as for safety, according to North Island MLA Claire Trevena.

She is urging both Telus and the Ministry of Technology and Citizen Services to step up and ensure north island communities receive equity in service. She has written to request action on broadband internet, cell service and pagers.

"It's 2015 and we are falling behind," said Trevena. "I regularly hear about the lack of cell coverage on our major highways – 19 and 28 – and another accident highlighted how desperate that need is.

"Quadra and Cortes Islands need to have broadband access as do communities in the north. It allows access to education, to healthcare, to economic opportunities.

"This is as important to communities as electrification once was. Our communities are no less deserving than the south island or lower mainland."

Trevena is also raising with both Telus and the government concerns about the potential loss of pager service. In areas where there is no cell phone, pagers are the lifeline for emergency responders.

She has offered to work with Telus and the Ministry to find solutions which would allow all north island communities to be connected.

## Thanks from Seniors Housing

**S** eniors Housing on Quadra has had residents now for over four years. Time flies by, and the Board continues to manage the property and pay down the debt as much as possible. The five units built are occupied by nine tenants.

Last spring the landscaping was completed around the fifth unit (which has been occupied for more than a year). At this time fine tuning of the housing project is underway, with upgrades for safety and convenience installed, and minor repairs being done as needed.

The current Board of Directors is a hard-working, practical group

of dedicated volunteers with many different types of experience. They're doing a great job and making good choices for the future of Seniors Housing.

The Board thanks the following for their kind assistance: Maria Leang for analyzing the insurance coverage and making recommendations, Ron Lolacher for carpentry repairs to the outside storage cupboards, Gerald Ammundsen for working on Boxing Day with Board member Nancy Allwarden to repair a broken heating system, Paul Horner for installing safety handles in

Seniors Housing, continued one unit, and to Board member Trevor Johnston for his ongoing supervision of the physical plant maintenance. Thanks are also due to Al Beattie, Alan Burnett, Trevor Johnston and Val Barr for cleaning up branches and firewood after a stand of alders were removed. The wood was delivered to the Free Firewood program.

The Quadra Island Seniors Housing Society appreciates the continuing community support. Thank you to both Tru-Value Stores for their one percent donation and their customers who choose #275 to support the Seniors Housing Project. This money contributes to paying down the mortgage each year.

If you'd like to eventually live in our Seniors Housing complex, the Society encourages you to fill out an application to have your name added to the wait list. To apply, you must be a resident of Quadra Island for the last two years, and at least 65 years old. If your partner or spouse is under 65, but you meet the age requirement, you can still apply. ## Making a Family Grab-and-Go Kit

ebruary is the month of love. Show your family you love them by looking towards their future safety. Assemble a do-it-yourself family emergency preparedness kit that includes a stylish, yet practical grab-and-go bag. The grab-and-go bag will help prepare you and your loved ones for unexpected events and emergencies. If you're asked to evacuate on short notice, you could be out of your home for 72 hours or more.

Assemble a grab-and-go bag for your home, workplace and vehicle. Start by identifying the basic supplies you need and then keep them in a secure location, ideally accessible from outside your home or in your hall closet. If your family consists of more than two people, each family member can have their own bag to carry. Old backpacks or hockey bags may not be stylish, but they work well and you most likely already have them. Children may also need a special blanket or toy in their bag for security.

As you assemble your bag remember that if the power is out, cash machines will not work, medications will be unavailable and Vancouver Island only has three days of food available at any given time. If it is a large quake, water tables may shift – think of the hot springs in Haida Gwaii – and it could be a week before outside help arrives.

Most items you need you probably already have and just need to collect them together. The list below will get you started. For more info check EMBC at <a href="https://www.emergencyinfobc.bc.ca">www.emergencyinfobc.bc.ca</a> for a more comprehensive list.

Remember to keep at least a half tank of gas in your vehicle at all times – you never know when you'll need it. And have the following items on hand:

- Flashlight
- Battery powered radio
- First-aid kit
- Multi-purpose tool and duct tape. (With duct tape you can pretty well fix anything!)
- Cash in small denominations
- Personal identification: Drivers licence, medical information, photocopy of passport, insurance information.

- Prescription medication: Rotate pills regularly
- Eyeglasses
- Personal items, including a change of underwear, toiletries, small towel.
- Basic survival items such as water (two litres per person per day), energy bars, snack food, dried fruit, chocolate. Remember to rotate all food regularly.
- Garbage bags or emergency poncho
- Family contact information: Phone number of someone elsewhere in the province or country where all members of the family will check in.



## LNG, Fracking and BC's Energy Future

The Council of Canadians Campbell River chapter and Timberline Earth Club invite you to an informative discussion on the ramifications of LNG development and fracking on BC's energy future on Wednesday, February 11 at 7pm at North Island College Theatre, 1681 South Dogwood Street.

Admission is by donation, and our speakers are Dr Eoin Finn and Leila Darwish.

The public has so far heard lots of promises about the economic benefits of a proposed liquid natural gas (LNG) industry powered by hydraulic fracturing (fracking) in northeast BC. Increasingly, questions are being asked about the credibility of these claims and the environmental impacts of fracking, pipelines, LNG export plants and supertankers. With over 14 LNG export terminals being proposed for the BC coast - including a massive LNG plant to be located on the old pulp and paper mill site just north of Campbell River - there is rising opposition from communities across the province as the true impacts of fracking and LNG come to light, and a call for a more sustainable energy future. Why put communities and climate at risk and threaten BCs drinking water, rivers and ocean, wild salmon, air quality, farmlands and wilderness areas for a dangerous LNG pipe dream?

Dr Eoin Finn is a retired KMPG partner, holds a PhD in physical chemistry and an MBA in International business, and is a member of My Sea to Sky and The Future Of Howe Sound Society, two community groups active in raising concern and opposition to the Woodfibre LNG project currently proposed for Squamish and Howe Sound. His multi media presentation will focus on the economics of exporting LNG from BC and public safety and pollution concerns about LNG plants and tankers.

Leila Darwish is the BC-Yukon Regional Organizer for the Council of Canadians. Over the last decade, she has worked as a community organizer for different environmental organizations and community groups in BC, Alberta, and the USA on campaigns such as fracking, tar sands, pipelines, nuclear energy, coal, climate justice, water protection and more. She has spent the last several months organizing with communities across BC that are fighting fracked gas pipelines and LNG proposals.

The Museum at Campbell River will host UVic guest speaker Neil Vallance on Saturday February 7 from 1–2:30pm. Vallance will speak to the topic 'The Long Silence of the Vancouver Island (also known at the Douglas) Treaties of 1850-1854'. According to Vallance, "Between 1850 and 1854 fourteen




treaties were negotiated by a number of Vancouver Island First Nations (including two near Port Hardy) with James Douglas, a Hudson's Bay Company Chief Factor acting as agent of the Crown. My talk is in part a cautionary tale about the subsequent silencings of the Vancouver Island Treaties (the 'VI Treaties'), but it is also a search for ways to restore their voice. I begin with a short description of the initial, nearly complete, silencing. Next I present three long-neglected First Nation accounts of the VI Treaties, and compare them with the standard colonial narratives. I then argue that the written versions of the treaty do not accurately reflect the terms agreed upon at the treaty meetings. In my opinion the First Nations accounts offer an alternate (and more convincing) narrative in which the agreements made were not to cede but to share land, resources and jurisdiction. In a search for comparable land agreements, I have looked at Kemp's Deed, entered into by Britain with the Ngai Tahu people of New Zealand in 1848, and the treaties entered into by the United States with Native Americans in Washington Territory during the 1850s. In the final section I describe the imposition of the second silencing and offer suggestions for ending it. Along the way I will describe my research adventures in the

archives of Canada, the western United States and New Zealand."

Neil Vallance retired from the part-time practice of law in Victoria to begin his PhD at UVic in 2010. Since 1999 he has also been researching and preparing historical reports on claims by First Nations alleging the failure of the Crown to fulfil promises made in the so-called Douglas Treaties, fourteen of which were entered into with Vancouver Island First Nations between 1850 and 1854. Neil is drawing upon this body of accumulated knowledge in his dissertation, tentatively entitled *Sharing the Land*.
