## New Art in Our Park

On July 10 at the Community Centre, members and friends of the Quadra Trails Committee gathered for the unveiling of an outdoor sculpture dedicated to past and present trails volunteers, and to Judy Leicester.

Julie Mellanby, an avid trails member who worked with Judy for years, introduced the piece with these words: "This is a beautiful carving, and I want to say that it's not really here as a shrine, it's not really here as a memorial - it's here for us to remember all the trails volunteers over the years who have worked to keep our trails safe and maintained. Judy Leicester was one of them, and she dedicated so much to get us going and to keep us going .... Some people leave us way too soon, and some people leave us way too young, and they're way too loved. This sculpture is to remember Judy Leicester, who was one of those people."

Vinay Chafekar's spectacular carving is made from old growth cedar, and features the tools familiar to all trail workers: backpack, water bottle, maddock, and shovel. Kevin Mackenzie's metal art completes the work with a cedar sapling – a tree that will never be cut down, a fitting symbol for the Trails committee and the network of hiking paths they've created all over the island.

You'll find the sculpture at the start of the Community Centre Trail, just past the baseball diamond, housed under Richard Leicester's Japanese-style roofed pergola.

## REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT • News from Area C by Jim Abram

Before I get into the business of my report, I would like to express my sincerest condolences to the entire Assu family of Cape Mudge. It came to my attention earlier today that Chief Don Assu has passed on. I have worked with Don on many projects over many years and will miss him. It is hard to put into words how much he has done for his people and this Island and the nation during his career. May he rest in peace.

This has been another very busy reporting period, but since it is still over 30 degrees in my house and late in the evening, I am going to try and keep this as short as possible.

#### Water usage

I know that as islanders on wells, most of you are aware of the conservation measures that you need to follow year round. Other areas are under severe water restrictions due to the drought-like conditions that we are experiencing with no end in sight.

I would just like to remind everyone to try and conserve even more water than you would normally in your daily usage. We have no idea what our aquifer looks like and since the Provincial Govt. has repeatedly neglected the mapping of aquifers throughout the province, we need to be extra vigilant.

#### Fire season

As you know, we are in the thick of it. A great deal of my time has been spent in the past weeks lobbying the Province to get all of the resources that we have available to us out there fighting fires. This included the MARS water bomber, based in Sproat Lake within sight of the Dog Mountain fire that burned for days without the Province allowing the MARS to put it out. It has finally been tasked to work in Nelson, but only after a province wide petition and daily media forced the hand of the Minister. The petition gathered over 20,000 signatures in about 3 days! I did many media shows in support of using this resource. I have seen it work in our area and it has put out fires all around us. This is why I was so engaged in the process of making sure that we have all the protection that we can possibly get.

## UBCM Executive meeting

I just returned from 4 days of UBCM Executive meetings (I am a Director at Large) in Richmond dealing with many of the issues that effect us all locally, provincially and federally. I am on the Resolutions committee and the Environment committee. We had 164 resolutions from all of the local governments in BC and dealt with each and every one of them along with lengthy staff reports to go with them. I am not allowed to divulge the disposition of each one but I can say that they will be published in the near future online and that we dealt with some issues that you will be pleased to see UBCM taking a stand on. The convention is a week long at the end of September.

#### SRD Parks Department visit

By the time you read this I will have toured the entire island with some of the representatives of the major groups on the island along with our new Parks Planner, Victoria Smith.

She will be picking up on a lot of the work that was formerly done by Beth Rees, now retired.

We have lots of unfinished business to deal with along with new proposals. More to follow in my next report. We will be dealing with all of the other issues that I have mentioned recently in other reports, in the next weeks and months. No need to go into them at this point, More information will be coming in and I will pass it along to you as I get it.

So, as I said this is going to be a short report, but I wanted to at least fill you in on a few items.





Sarah Boyes is a colourful, funny and loving Quadra Islander. In her spare time, she enjoys belly-dancing, choreography, costuming and directing. However, Sarah also relies on her education and experience to continue her successful career as a sign maker and picture and memorabilia framer .

Sarah's upbringing was unquestionably unique. She was born in Manitoba, and her family moved to Germany, where she lived from the ages of two to five. They then relocated to the Edmonton area until she reached the age of eight. At that time, they moved back to Germany until Sarah was thirteen. Eventually, Sarah and her family relocated to Comox.



She attended the University of Victoria, and graduated with a baccalaureate degree in Linguistics and Psychology in 1989. Following her studies in Victoria, Sarah lived in Comox, then in

Oyster River. She moved to Quadra in 1998.

Entering the sign-making business was in part a matter of talent and part kismet. Sarah is well-known and respected for her ambitious, and always flawless work. Take a tour through the Nuyumbalees Cultural Centre and you will encounter large totem pole prints and other work which was coordinated by Sarah,. Look at most of the signs that stand out on the island, and likely you will start to appreciate the knowledge and hard-working ethic of Sarah Boyes.

Sarah is also a local ambassador. She helped to rally the community together to support Sunday Dennis, an admired local woman who was diagnosed with a very aggressive brain tumor. 

## PHILIPPINE CONNECTION'S 21<sup>ST</sup> ANNUAL GIANT GARAGE SALE

TART SAVING NOW! for the Quadra Philippine Connection's 21st annual Giant Garage Sale to be held on September 20th at Quadra Community Centre. Drop-off locations will be announced toward the end of August.

As many of you know, Quadra is now involved in an exciting new poverty alleviating project in the Philippines called "Passing on the Gift for Peace". This is a program for which IAT, our sponsor organization, has received an international award and that that will have far reaching effects. It promotes self sufficiency and economic stability for the tribal people in the Kalinga area of northern Luzon where Quadra has been supporting daycares. This in turn helps to cultivate a spirit of cooperation and unity amongst a tribal people who have had a past history of conflict and violence.

Until about 30 years ago, the Kalinga area of the northern Philippines was isolated and undeveloped. Tribal people lived in a traditional manner where inter-tribal war was the norm. As the Cordillera area, as it is known, had modern ways thrust upon it, its tribal people became more and more marginalized. It has been quite common for villages to starve, go without medicines, education and sanitation. IAT has been making great gains at creating positive change in this regard through their innovative programs, including the Gift for Peace.

During our visit to Tabuk in February, we were able to visit Katau, the village that Quadra will be supporting as our contribution to this project. This community consists of 40 families that relocated from the mountains for economic benefit enabling the men to obtain work on nearby farms. Twenty families in this village will receive 20 carabao to pass on in three years to 20 families of another village that they have had past conflict with. In addition to animal dispersement, training seminars on leadership, savings, animal health management, agro-forestry, health, nutrition and composting will be provided through IAT. This process has already begun. Another part of our support includes sponsoring the education of two young girls from Katau as a way of further contributing to the upliftment of this village. School has resumed in the Philippines as of the beginning of June and

the following is a recent letter from Analiza, our new sponsored student!

#### Dear sponsor, Quadra Island Community,

Hello from your sponsored child here in the Philippines! How are you right now? My family circle and I wish that you are in good health as we are here in Kalinga Province. We also hope your weather is in good condition. Here, we are experiencing a hot

temperature because it is summer. When you look around, many people are always carrying their umbrellas and also using a fan just to get air from it. But for me, I just go under the trees to breathe the fresh air and try to stay cool.

Last summer vacation, I helped my parents, especially my mother in doing household chores because I am the eldest among my two siblings. I am the one who washes our clothes, fetches water and cleans the surroundings, especially our little backyard garden. I removed the weeds and also always watered the plants so that the vegetables that my mother planted will easily grow and give fruits. I learned that if you care and love what you are doing, it will make you happy and make your work easier. Sometimes I also carry my youngest brother when my parents are away from us working in the field so that we can have food. So I am learning to love and care for my siblings.

Our school classes started on June 1st. I woke up early in the morning as I usually do to wash the dishes from the night before when my parents served our food. Then I prepared my uniform to use at school. I took a bath and

put on my uniform and then went with my parents and said good-bye when I was in our classroom. I was happy from that time to meet new friends and classmates. At first I was shy but realized that there is nothing to do if you are faint hearted. That is why I am learning to play with others even if I don't know them well. My class passed by not looking at the time and that was the first day of school being a grade 3 student.

That is all for now and thank-you so much for your support to me especially in my studies. Wishing you more blessings and good health.




### ONBOARD RAFIKI

### **Home Waters**

TT Te decided to spend most of July around Quadra, harvesting the summer bounty and getting "stuff" done. When we got back home and first stepped foot in our house, I just about fell over from how big it seemed inside; it looked so spacious and grandiose that I had to sit down in one of four chairs at one of two tables to take it in (and did I hear an echo?). At first, the novelty of flushing a toilet with the simple push of a lever and turning a tap on with just the twist of a knob, none of that fidgety pumping business, was hilarious and pleasing, part of the joyous ease of home. But soon the novelty wore off and the practical and simple life at sea started a-calling. We were actually only home one night from our southern journey before heading to Read Island for a weekend with some friends (a common passage for us). One night we piled everyone on to Rafiki and flew the spinnaker under the light of a nearly full moon, chasing the waves down a moonlit path. One of the best parts of having a sailboat is sharing it with people, giving folks a unique and truly

coastal experience. Our family came down to visit the next weekend, and we took them out on a rather blustery day over to Carrington Bay. On one particularly angular heel, we nearly lost my mother-in-law (not on purpose!), but managed to right in the nick of time and keep everyone aboard.

Our land-home kept us bound in duty for another week - picking berries galore, oh! the suffering! - before we cast our lines again and headed for Toba Inlet. It's a wholly triumphant feeling seeing the passages and channels on the charts come into a vivid and tangible reality. All the little corners and tiny islands, the big reaches and rounded bays that we know from the chart on the wall at home are now images in our minds, filled with details and memories of experience; things the chart doesn't say, like how the water in Toba is practically fresh, and some of those marked creeks are actually waterfalls launching over the bluffs and directly into the sea. I couldn't ask for a better life than this one, with nothing but paradise everywhere I look.





# Is it Time to Say 'Good Bye' to TimberWest?

In a joint op-ed piece in the Vancouver Sun "*Recall TimberWest's Logging Permits*" July 20, 2015 representatives from a coalition of environmental NGOs (Sierra Club B.C, Greenpeace & ForestEthics Solutions) outline the egregious logging practices that TimberWest has recently perpetrated along the coast; accelerating their cuts even as a landmark agreement to conserve vast tracts of irreplaceable forest in the Great Bear Rainforest is being finalized.

In the Discovery Islands we are essentially at the southern border of the Great Bear Rainforest and some of TimberWest's over-cutting, as outlined in the Sun op-ed, is taking place right here, on Quadra, Sonora, the other Discovery Islands and neighbouring mainland coast.

So while high-profile NGOs are calling on the Government of BC to revoke the company's cutting rights as a penalty for these infractions, the question has to be asked "What are *we* going to do about this corporation running amok in our midst?

With much of Quadra Island's second growth reaching maturity TimberWest are busy cutting trees on our Island like there is no tomorrow. Oh sure there are 'special' management guidelines in place that limit the size of individual cutblocks but the truth is that this is starting to look like 'death by a thousand cuts' as hundreds of these 5 hectare blocks appear, one after another after another.

Most of Quadra Island is Crown Land. That in theory means it is public land owned by you and me. But TimberWest act as if it's their land to do with what they wish. They contribute nothing to our community of any substance - not so long ago they actually turned down a request for one single tree to be used for one of the Regional District wharf projects - one tree! Despite the millions of dollars worth of timber TimberWest extract from Quadra Island I can't think of a single tangible benefit the community has received in return.

Yes there are a few local jobs but along with those comes TimberWest's notorious reputation for predatory relationships with their sub-contractors. Squeezing smaller businesses for every last dollar, some even into bankruptcy. Any employment TimberWest are responsible for could be easily recreated on better terms by an alternative land and resources management model.

With new ideas circulating about a potential Regional Park also come ideas for community forest projects, to say nothing of First Nations land claims for which TimberWest are racing to ensure amounts to fields of stumps by the time any such deals are made.

Is it time to say goodbye to TimberWest? Is this not a community with a more creative and sustainable vision than simply being a cash cow for a plundering, raw log exporting corporate parasite?

We have some of the most respected people in the coastal forest industry and Government Ministries right here in the community. You have to think that not only are the Discovery Islands geographically situated at the edge of the Great Bear Rainforest but *should be* at the cutting edge of demonstrating that new paradigm of land management model in practice.

Revoking TimberWest's Tree Farm License on Quadra, and more seriously enforcing its annual allowable cut on the neighbouring islands is a pathway to greater local control and access to our public forest resources. This does not need to be a battle between environmentalists and logging but rather a stage for a new cooperative vision for our community where everyone benefits, not just TimberWest's shareholders whose demand for profit are driving this rapacious company's practices right up to our doorsteps. Who honestly would shed a tear to see them go?




