Quadra's Eric Peterson Awarded Order of Canada



On May 12, 2017, in a formal ceremony at Rideau Hall, Governor General David Johnson presented Eric L. Peterson of Heriot Bay the Order of Canada, Canada's most prestigious and meaningful award to Canadians who "desire a better Canada". We on Quadra Island know Eric as the cofounder, along with his wife Christina Munck, of Tula Foundation and the force behind Hakai Institute, a science research institute located on Calvert and Quadra Islands. Eric was recognized with the Order of Canada medal and the following words:

"Eric Peterson is a hands-on philanthropist who supports initiatives that produce tangible results. Following his success as a scientist and entrepreneur in the field of medical imaging, he launched the Tula Foundation to tackle deep-rooted health and environmental issues through science, education and community leadership. His efforts, in collaboration with a network of partners, have resulted in several notable programs, including the Hakai Institute, which conducts long-term ecological research and community initiatives in remote locations on the British Columbia coast; and TulaSalud, which addresses primary health systems and nursing in rural regions of Guatemala."

Quadra's Old Growth - Ancients

Thank you to the volunteers
on Quadra who have taken to
walking their favourite trails and
now record the presence of the
very scarce Old Growth Trees
(250+ years of age).

Aging of a tree: I've developed
the following chart for Quadra
Island. Foresters / purist tree
botanists will argue that without
an actual core bore my chart
is inaccurate. True, but I'm
doing citizen science, not a PhD
Thesis. Foresters will report
their measurements as diameter
at breast height dbh. The dbh
standard is no less subjective:
where is breast height?

**Trees by size and approximate
age**

- a) 5 ft. C / 1.6 m C / 60 years (ready to harvest)
- b) 8 ft. C / 2.5m = 100 years (mature / prime to harvest)
- c) 10 ft C / 3.0m C = 150 years (over mature)
- d) 11 ft C / 3.3 m = 200 years (decadent / over mature)
- e) 12 ft C / 3.6 m C = 250 years plus
- labeled by government as Old Growth
- worth big \$\$\$\$ as export logs
- f) 13 ft C / 3.9 m C = 350 years OG
- g) 14 ft C / 4.2 m C = 400 years OG
- h) 15 ft C / 4.5 m C = 450 years OG



- i) 16 ft C / 4.8 m. C = 500 years OG
- j) 17 ft C / 5.1 m C = 600 years OG
- k) 18 ft C / 5.5 m C = 700 years OG
- l) 20 ft C / 6 m C = 850 years OG
- m) 26 ft C / 7.87 m C / 1,000 + years OG

Walk any of the numerous trails,
this time stop, to really look at
the trees in the forest. If they
are as wide as your shoulders
the trees are about 100 years; 2
people wide could be 300 - 400
years. Any tree smaller than 2
men at the shoulder, was too
small to cut in 1930!

Look for the gnarly trees, sap-
dripping trees, those with many
limbs starting just meters above
the forest floor. Guess why they
were not cut 80 years ago.

A closing thought to muse over:
Human old growth on Quadra
Island, those over age 60, are
approximately 1,000 in number.
We outnumber the forest
ancients 4:1. Some economists
will argue that human ancients,
those over 65, are well beyond
having any productive value!
Why is this belief the same for old
growth forests?

Problems with the Golf Course Subdivision

Quadra Links has applied for rezoning of approx. 26 hectares (approx. 64 acres) of the land currently zoned as a golf course (Recreation Commercial). The plan is to develop a 17 lot strata subdivision with the entrance off Milton Road. The lots planned are 1.7 to 3.7 acres.

These are the problems with this plan.

Not so many years ago, there was a review of Quadra's Official Community Plan which involved almost a year of neighbourhood meetings on various parts of the island. One of these Local Area Plans focused on the area bounded by Heriot Bay Rd to Topcliffe, Animal Farm/Barton to Milford. As part of these meetings, significant consideration was given to the possibility of allowing the subdivision of the existing 5 acre lots. The idea of smaller lots was rejected for two reasons:

the rural character of the area would be damaged and the sustainability of the water supply might be at risk. It was also decided in the OCP review that any increase in housing density should be confined to the Cove and possibly to Heriot Bay.

This proposed development of 17 small lots on the golf course land is not in accord with the OCP, contrary to statements made in the rezoning application, nor is it consistent

with the Recreation Commercial designation as also stated in the application.

At the time the land for the golf course was rezoned to Recreation Commercial, both Quadra Links and our Regional Director made a commitment to keeping the land free form housing.

Right now there is a shortage of housing on Quadra, both for purchase and for rent.

This shortage will definitely be alleviated by the exciting possibilities for a real village at the Cove for which plans are in the works. It is the purpose of the Cove Village Plan and the intention of the new owners to provide a mixed income, mixed generation community in greater density than is allowed elsewhere on the island. You can be sure that if the subdivision at the golf course is allowed, the lots will not be reasonably priced and houses will be subject to a covenant with respect to design.

The small park proposed in the application is in fact largely swamp and so not usable year round. In spite of this wetland, there have always been water concerns in this neighbourhood. I believe many residents are using shallow wells which could be impacted by new development on this scale.

Quadra Links has not made its rezoning application available to

the public, nor have they made arrangements for community participation or response as other developers have done in the past and before the public hearing concerning their application. In fact it's very difficult to even locate this application on the regional district website.

It's sad to say that the Regional District planners who worked on this proposal and added their recommendations to it have never been on Quadra and therefore can't possibly say that this proposal fits with the country residential character of the area as is stated in the application. They have never seen the area.

Milton Rd. is currently used for walking by many islanders who come from other parts of the island, including young mothers who bring their children in strollers. As the proposed road entrance to this subdivision is from Milton Rd, it is quite likely that traffic along Milton will be significantly increased which will change its rural nature and its safety for non vehicular usage.

RCMP Report

On May 6th, 2017 Quadra RCMP conducted a traffic stop on a person operating a motorcycle in Heriot Bay. The person was prohibited from driving and was issued an appearance notice to attend court and the motorcycle was impounded.

On May 9th, 2017 Quadra RCMP and Quadra Fire Department responded to a logging truck accident on Heriot Bay road by Taku road on Quadra Island. The logging truck was travelling on Heriot Bay road and had its grappling hook up which caught the power lines. The power lines were pulled down and a fire resulted which was dealt with by Quadra Fire department. The driver did receive a shock and was taken to the hospital for precautionary measures but was relatively uninjured.

On May 12th, 2017 Quadra RCMP received a report in which the victim lost several hundred dollars in a computer scam. The suspect was calling from a New York area code and gained access to the victims computer. The scam artist then convinced the victim to buy several hundred dollars in iTunes gift cards and the card numbers were then given to the suspect. Quadra RCMP would like to remind the public that there are many different types of scams out there trying to get your hard earned money. One of the indicators of a scam like this is when the scam artist asks for money in the form of iTunes gift cards. Normal reputable companies do not ask for iTunes gift cards for payment. If you have any doubts call the Quadra RCMP before you part with your money.

On May 12th, 2017 Quadra RCMP conducted a traffic stop on a male in Squirrel Cove. The male had been consuming alcohol earlier in the day. The male provided breath samples into two different approved screening devices both resulting in a FAIL reading. The male was issued a 90 day Immediate Roadside Prohibition (IRP) from driving as well as a violation ticket for not having a valid drivers licence.

Let's Harmonize Quadra Island's Fire Prevention Standards!

The residents of Bold Point and Village Bay Lakes communities are organizing to protect not only their community from fire, but all of Quadra Island, by networking with all stakeholders to construct a Quadra Island Burn Bylaw that will harmonize, regulate and enforce all burning activities on public and private lands.

"Wildfires are a serious risk to all of us on Quadra Island. The residents living in the Village Bay Lakes area, including the long-established Bold Point community have no fire protection except ourselves. We have no fire department. If a fire starts in our community, it could spread quickly to the

south end, too. So it is imperative that the regulations that protect the rest of Quadra include our part of the island. We are all in this together and together we need to find a solution," says Lu Schanfarber, one of the community members of the organizing committee."

A Community Petition to Help Prevent Wild Fires on Quadra

To: Tom Yates, Chief Administrative Officer, Strathcona Regional District; Dave Leitch, Chief Administrative Officer, Strathcona Regional District; Jim Abram, Regional Director, Area C

We, the undersigned residents of Quadra Island, petition the Strathcona Regional District to research options for creating a Quadra Island Burn Bylaw, that harmonizes the Fire Prevention Standards for all of Quadra Island. The purpose of this bylaw is to regulate, and enforce all burning activities on public and private land. Currently Quadra Island has two separate mandates for fire prevention strategies. One administered by the South Quadra Improvement District. North Quadra is administered by the Ministry of Forests. One set of standards would make

sense. Quadra Island is extremely vulnerable to wildfire, human caused or otherwise. A wildfire anywhere on the island has potential to affect everyone.

On March 7, 2017 a draft copy of this Petition was presented to the Fire Dept. Board of Directors meeting for discussion. The petition was asking to authorize the Quadra Island Fire Dept to set fire hazard ratings as well as, regulating and enforcing all burning on public and private land. The Burn Bylaw model that was looked at demanded that the South Quadra Improvement District extend their boundary to service North Quadra with a Firehall. This model was rejected by the Board as unworkable due to liability expenses, lack of enforcement capabilities, and the huge expense and logistic problems of response times and staffing of a Fire Hall somewhere on North Quadra.

On April 12, 2017 the Strathcona Regional District had a meeting and discussed a committee report regarding the Burn Bylaw. The complexities of two separate jurisdictions on Quadra Island would make it necessary for the Strathcona Regional District to custom design a Bylaw that will fit Quadra Island. Subsequent to that meeting, a discussion with Tom Yates - S.R.D. was had. He spoke to the importance of the community demonstrating strong support for this initiative before they proceed to do research and development. Help Reduce Accidental 9-1-1 Calls Public Education Campaign Aims to Make North Island Safer

North Island 9-1-1 Corporation in partnership with E-Comm 9-1-1 are launching a public education campaign to help reduce accidental 9-1-1 phone calls within your community. North Island 9-1-1 Corporation was established in 1995 to provide and manage emergency 9-1-1 services to the Comox Valley Regional District, the Strathcona Regional Hospital District, the Regional Districts of Mount Waddington and Alberni-Clayoquot and a portion (School District No. 69) of the Nanaimo Regional District. In 1999, Powell River Regional District joined the service (excluding Lasqueti Island). Initial call answering for 9-1-1 calls within North Island region are handled through E-Comm. The emergency communications centre handles thousands of accidental calls to 9-1-1 each year. "Every year thousands of accidental 9-1-1 calls occur within our vast coverage area," states North Island 9-1-1 President Larry Samson. "What residents might not be aware of is that there are few simple tips to help reduce these calls to ensure time is spent on real emergencies."

Every time 9-1-1 is accidentally called from a landline, operators are required to call back these dropped calls to determine whether they are real emergencies. If the operator can't contact anyone, a police officer can be dispatched to physically verify. Cellphones further complicate the process because, unlike with landlines, they provide only general location information to the call-taker so tracking down callers to confirm it was an accidental call is a challenge.

North Island 9-1-1 and E-Comm are asking residents to:

- Protect your phone by locking it and storing it carefully.
- Ensure 911 is not pre-programmed into mobile or landline phones.
- Never give old cell phones to children to use as toys; de-commissioned phones can still dial 911.

Finally if you happen to accidentally call 911 please stay on the line to ensure the operator is aware there is no emergency.

I later managed to hound Telus enough to get them to put their equipment on the Cantel / Rogers tower at Noble and Heriot Bay Rd. to improve the area covered and with a higher level of coverage being LTE in some parts. This has been a slow never ending battle, but one I chose to fight to the end and am still continuing on your behalf.

I met with the Discovery Islands Chamber of Commerce and others some months ago and some have finally picked up on trying to gather support from Telus to increase coverage through a petition and letters as I suggested. I am confident that this effort will at least show the ever increasing need for better connectivity of all sorts, but what Telus does with it is anyone's guess! I will certainly use the info in my lobbying efforts and it is so important that whatever people are doing, they forward it to me for use... letters, petitions or whatever!.

I would caution everyone that the petition and letters, though asking for improved coverage,

will require a number of very expensive cell towers and will never reach all of the nooks and crannies on the island's topography. It just isn't possible, so don't expect a perfect world. Some areas will never have cell service back in the areas that it is being sought for... Also remember this "ask" will be subject to public (neighbourhood) scrutiny, and the willingness of the companies to spend the huge amounts of money to put in such a network if it is even possible in our terrain ...

The following is the latest email that I received from Telus regarding my hounding them for better service. I have only included the first portion as the rest would require his permission:

"Jim I continue to look for opportunities to get Quadra included in the programs. Over the past few years the transport, xDLS infrastructure, and cell services have upgraded and I have been cyclically inserting requests to the planners of the fibre and cellular build programs. I hope to have some additional details in a few weeks. I'll get you an update when I get the info back from the planners on my most recent ask.

And now on to the news that I have kept you hanging for!

SRD Moves on its Strategic Priority to Improve Broadband Connectivity in the Region

The SRD has also made a significant application to the Connect to Innovate Program. This is a \$500 Million federal funding program aimed at improving broadband connectivity for rural and remote communities. The application put forward by the SRD is for a new subsea fibre-optic network with the potential to benefit many coastal communities within the region and beyond. If successful, this fully-funded 'backbone' infrastructure will deliver high speed broadband to landing points in eligible coastal communities (that would be "us"). Internet service providers can access these 'points of presence' to provide improved service to residents, institutions and businesses through local distribution networks. Applications closed on April 20th and funding announcements are expected later this year. We are told that we are on the top of the list and this will allow us to remove ourselves from the Telus network and be on one that is run by the SRD, most likely. The cost will be

far less and it will actually be available!!!

Improvements and upgrades to 'last-mile' or local distribution networks owned and operated by ISP's (Independent Service Providers) are also being contemplated. Through the provincial Strategic Priorities Fund, the SRD will be submitting an application for capital improvement projects nominated by local ISPs. Applications for this program close on June 1st. This will include our local providers and will allow high-speed fibre-optic and cable connectivity to all of our residents. This is what is meant by "last mile". There is the "backbone" (undersea fibre) and there is the "last mile" (the delivery to your door").

It is important to note here that the Board came up with three eligible projects for this funding but the funding program only allowed for two projects to be submitted. This is where I had to do my work at the Board table and convince the Board that the two that would be applied for would be for Strathcona Gardens and for Broadband Connectivity. The third project was for a long-standing Area D water project I felt horrible having to deny support to Area D, but we do have to make tough decisions and this was one that I could not let slip by. We "discussed" as a Board at length and when the vote was taken, we won!!! So the two applications will go in and provide sufficient money to deal with the "last mile" connections. Phew!

This is so very exciting and brings autonomy to so many communities along the coast and around Vancouver Island. There is so much more that I have to tell you about this but it has not yet been released to the public. As soon as it is I will be free to share it with you. I hope this is all considered good news and you will continue to support my efforts at the Board and Provincial level to improve our service.

Planning Grant for Area C

I also successfully argued for the fine work done by our staff in getting an application in for a planning grant to review the Area C and the Desolation Sound Rural Land Use Bylaw in the next year. This will include a sustainability component and is something that is being included in the most progressive regions. It will help us to develop tools so that we can put all of your good ideas on how to be sustainable into action. Another very exciting development for our area and I have to thank our staff for keeping their eyes open for these grants when they become available. We don't get much notice nor much time to apply and

Dog Bylaw update

After my complete rejection of the very expensive bylaw that was brought forward over a year ago, I have been working directly with the owner of the animal control service on Vancouver Island and with the RCMP. After numerous long phone calls, negotiations with SRD staff and an in person meeting with our RCMP I think we are very close to an acceptable bylaw that will meet our needs and not cost us lots of money. I am due to talk to the owner in a few days and will update you further. This has not been a situation of "nothing is happening", it has been a situation of there is a lot to sort out. It is happening!

Upcoming events, etc.

There will be a Public Hearing for the Tula Foundation (based here on Quadra) for a large foreshore lease for research purposes on May 17th at 7pm at the Quadra Island Community Centre (QICC).

There will also be a Public Hearing for a proposal to sub-divide a portion off of the Golf Course property and create a number of smaller lots to be held at the QICC at 7pm on June 21st.

I will be attending two days of Provincial / First Nations marine planning meetings (MaPP) in Campbell River and another day of Federal marine planning meetings the following day from May 29 - June 1.

The usual Committee and Board meetings will also be on my agenda as well as the Comox Valley Solid Waste meetings and the new committee that I am on dealing with Waste to Energy (an offshoot of that Board) and the Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District Board meetings.

I will also be presenting at the Province wide Community to Community Forum which is hosted by the Union of BC Municipalities and the First Nations Summit in Vancouver on June 6th. I was one of the founding members of this forum and all of the Regional Community to Community Forums that were spawned by this larger forum. Most First Nations and local governments will be in attendance. Am I nervous? You bet! But what an honour!

Another full month ahead!
