

T's been the stuff of news, rumour and local, online banter ad nauseam but the pipe-dream of significant changes to the Campbell River - Quadra Island ferry service took its first official step forward this week with BC Ferries solicitation of public input on vessel replacement.

#### In a BC Ferries news release they said:

"BC Ferries' Bowen Class vessels (Bowen Queen, Mayne Queen and Powell River Queen) are nearing the end of their lifespans. The upcoming retirement of these vessels gives us an opportunity to address what we have heard from you about increased traffic and sailing wait times on the Campbell River – Quadra Island and Nanaimo Harbour – Gabriola Island routes.

While the Bowen Queen and Mayne Queen do not operate on these routes, we want to take this opportunity to hear your feedback as your input will help us with our vessel replacement and redeployment planning. Would you prefer one larger vessel that provides similar sailing frequency as the current service, or two smaller vessels with increased sailing frequency?

This is an exciting opportunity to invest in vessels that will further our operational resilience and capacity, while improving your travel experience with us.

Your feedback is important to us and will shape how we deliver a future service that best meets the needs of our customers and the communities we serve. We want to hear from you as your input will help us determine the right vessels to build.

We will be holding a drop-in information sessions in your community Campbell River - Quadra Island (Quathiaski Cove) Tuesday, July 24 at 10:00 am - 12:00 pm in the Quathiaski Cove Terminal. If you are unable to attend either of the sessions, you can share your views by completing a short survey between July 16 and July 26."

This survey is not something to be taken lightly or rushed into. Our community will likely be living with the decisions based on its outcomes for decades to come. The questions on face value seem innocuous enough but answers could have unanticipated consequences. For example question 2 asks respondents to rank aspects of ferry travel, just remember, it doesn't matter if your vessel "arrives and departs on time" if you're not actually on it!

We should pay attention to the advice of those that lived on the island with a 2 ferry system but not let nostalgia cloud the realities of the future. -DI

## **QISES July 2018 Report**

An update for those interested in Quadra Island Salmon Enhancement.

Now that the automatic counting system at Village Bay Lakes (which took up most of 2017) is up and running QISES has gotten back to other chores. On a trip to Luoma Creek for the annual inspection and/or clearing of two log jams, we put baited fry traps in the stream. Results were disappointing, possibly due to the short duration that the traps were in the stream. One cutthroat was trapped.

Work started this spring on the deconstruction and eventual demolition of the two oldest buildings at the Eco Center, the tiny office which is getting quite mouldy, and the outdoor hatchery which has been out of commission for well over a decade. Fish tanks and other aluminium equipment were disbursed locally after futile attempts were made to interest other Vancouver Island salmon groups in them.

On July 8, eleven hardy soles turned up at Drew Creek to start the beginning of a 2-year project, the enhancement of Drew Creek. At present any existing gravel is buried under sand and silt. It is hoped that our work will facilitate, during high water events, self flushing of the creek.

Near the mouth of the creek, upstream from the culvert, a huge amount of branch material was removed as well as a few logs that were blocking silt. When the culvert is replaced, hopefully next year, spawning gravel will be purchased and put in the stream bed.

Drought proofing work continued on Hyacinthe Creek in order to keep water trickling through the



summer drought. Broken lines were replaced earlier this spring. Siphon rates are being monitored so that the water bodies, Mud Lake, Reed Lake, and the big wetland, are not drawn down any more than necessary.

Finally, thanks to Tru Value, their Points Card system and islanders who put their shopping points into Quadra Salmon (257). In the Q-Cove store alone, QISES benefits from over \$1000 annually from this generosity.

## Proportional Representation: An overview - Part 2

**Part two** in this series provides important information about how to register to vote in this fall's referendum on BC's voting system. It also discusses what Proportional Representation is, which countries already use such a system, and what all the systems on the ballot have in common.

### How do I register to vote?

You can register to vote if you are 18 years old AND a Canadian citizen AND a BC resident for the last six months. If you voted in the 2017 B.C. election, you are most likely registered to vote, but if you are not sure or have moved, call Elections BC Voter Services at 1-800-661-8683. You can register to vote or update your information online https://eregister. electionsbc.gov.bc.ca/ovr/welcome.aspx# This is how to get around the fact that all of us on Quadra have a PO Box as our mailing address: Enter your street address first without a PO Box. Once you have finished with this screen the sytem will prompt you to enter a mailing address. Only enter your PO Box number, town, province and postal code - NOT your street address. When you finish the whole process you will see your home and mailing addresses listed separately. You will get an email of confirmation.

## So, what is Proportional Representation anyway?

Proportional Representation is a voting system in which the distribution of seats in the BC Legislative Assembly is apt to be proportional to the distribution of votes between the parties. A party that gets 39% of the vote gets pretty close to 39% of the seats. Under our current system, 39% of the vote can and has translated into a majority government with 100% of the power.

### Which countries use Proportional Representation and which do not?

Over 90 countries use a proportional respresentation system including over 80 percent of OECD countries (our peers) <u>https://www.fairvote.ca/pr4bc-faqs-</u> <u>mythbusters/</u> This includes economically successful countries such as Germany, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Belgium and the Netherlands. Many of these countries have used their current system for decades, without negative results such as too frequent elections. Canada, the US and the UK still use a First Past the Post system federally.

## What do all 3 systems on the BC Referendum have in common?

All of them are better than what we have now! All of them will mean the people who get elected more accurately reflect the values of the voters who voted for them because voters are less likely to vote strategically. All three systems maintain local representation so no area is without a representative in the BC Legislative Assembly. All three systems retain about the same number of MLAs we have now, although that number may slightly increase. All three systems require that a party must get at least 5% of the vote province wide in order to win a seat. www.theglobeandmail. com/canada/british-columbia/article-bcunveils-its-proposed-question-for-voters-inelectoral-reform/ This prevents fringe parties from getting elected. In the last three federal elections all 15-20 fringe parties put together got less than 1% of the vote.

## **Total Fire Ban** for Campbell River - Includes Camp Fires and Beach Fires

With hot, dry conditions and increased fire risk, a total fire ban is now in effect for Campbell River. The ban – effective at noon on Wednesday, July 18 – applies to all recreational fires, including beach fires and camp fires on private lands.

"We know people love to have summer camp fires and fires on the beach, but the fire risk is so great at this point that the entire Coastal Fire Region other than Haida Gwaii and what's called the coastal fog zone will have this prohibition in place," says fire chief Thomas Doherty.

"We appreciate everyone's assistance in doing their part to prevent wildfires in our community – and we are monitoring conditions," Doherty adds. "If the weather changes and the risk drops enough, we will certainly let people know when and how they can have recreational fires in Campbell River." This prohibition does not apply to CSA-rated or ULC-rated cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to portable camp fires that uses briquettes, liquid or gaseous fuel, as long as the height of the flame is less than 15 centimetres.

## REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT • News from Area C by Jim Abram

This is quite the heat wave we seem to be stuck in. I hope you are able to enjoy it and are not being adversely effected by it. With the fire danger at extreme, I sincerely hope everyone will take all precautions to avoid fires of any kind. I think we are probably breaking records. I know we are having to do a lot more watering than usual to keep plants alive! Now if the wind would just let up enough so I could possibly get a day to go fishing sometime between meetings. I will try to keep this to the main issues that are taking place at the moment.

We have full agendas on Wednesday the 18th at the Board and I will report on the outcomes in a future report. There will be many important issues, but I feel it best left until the Board has actually met and made decisions other than to just give you the items from the agenda, not knowing how the Board dealt with them.

### Stuart Island land acquisition

The first piece of good news is that after many years of trying to acquire the property on Stuart Island that the School District was no longer using we have finally been successful in our bid to accept the divestiture of the land from them, through the Province. This is at no cost, except minor survey, etc., and is great news to the Stuart Island Community Association. They currently have their structures on that property under long term licence with the Province. So the property is being transferred to the SRD and the water lease in front of the property that provides access is also being looked at for a Sponsored Free Crown Grant. I am very pleased with the cooperation of the School District, the Minister of Education, the Ministry of Forest and Lands (FLNRORD) and our Ministry of Municipal Affairs, for all of their help in making this happen. My thanks also go out to the Stuart Island Community Association for all of their cooperation and patience. This

has taken an incredible amount of lobbying to Ministers over the past couple of years and I am very pleased to see it coming to fruition. There is an official letter to our Chair that the SRD Board just received confirming the granting process on the DI web site.

### Meeting with Ministry of Transportation

And now for some more exciting news! Last Friday I had a long meeting with our two top Highways officials. It was great! They are both such "real" people and understand our rural needs and issues very well. We have gone back and forth on the road issues for so many years with our contractor telling us that they were underfunded and understaffed. They were right and I have used that argument continuously in my conversations with the Province. The Highways officials in Courtenay have been very receptive to our needs and ongoing problems and they have come through for us as you will see in the attachments to this report.

We are getting major paving done at the end of August / beginning of September. Some of it will be real pavement and some will be "double chip seal": they come through and prepare the road, chip seal it and then wait for a short time and then come through and chip seal it a second time! It is very important to note that after that initial chip seal the roads must be treated with respect if we want a good final product. This means no driving along the aprons, breaking off the edges, and keeping your speed down. After the road work is done, all the main roads will get new lines painted (and they promised they will do it before it starts raining!). Cross walks and stop lines will be done as possible.

They are totally re-doing the Hope Spring Road area, so I hope the residents there will be pleased. The intersection at Cape Mudge Rd. and Joyce Rd. is also being looked at for realignment for safety reasons. Their engineers are assessing it and seeing if it is feasible. This should take care of some of the very close calls at that corner.

As you can imagine, I am very pleased that Quadra Island is finally getting its turn at major work.

You should also know that Emcon was unsuccessful in its bid to get the contract for our roads and it was awarded to Mainroad Contracting. I do not have any details on any possible personnel changes, if any.

## Quadra Medical Clinic meetings

I have been sitting in on the meetings of the group that has formed to try and keep the Quadra Medical Clinic open (not to be confused with Harbourside Medical). We have had numerous meetings, numerous phone calls and endless emails. You have an incredible group of individuals working very hard on your behalf to carry out the mandate given by the community to "retain our existing services". They are also looking at creative ways to provide even more services and have Island Health and the Ministry fund them.

I was appointed by the Ministry and Island Health to be the "point person" to talk with the main contact at Island Health, Dr. Tom Gornall, after I had presented motions to both the SRD Board and the Comox Strathcona Regional Hospital District Board, which were supported unanimously. The Chairs of those Boards wrote to the Minister and other top officials at Island Health and we received immediate attention since out crisis is urgent.

A proposal has been presented by the group to Island Health and we are negotiating with them over how those items can be accomplished. We should hear back soon. In the mean time Dr. Boegel has been actively recruiting so that there will be new professionals to take her place when she leaves. She is going above and beyond what anyone could be expected to do to insure that her departure does not leave us short staffed at the Quadra Medical Clinic.

Updates will be published by the group regularly. Stay tuned! I am sure there will be a successful conclusion to this crisis due to the volunteers' commitment.

One more thing. The SRD has formed its corporate body and developed the articles of incorporation to deal with installing the backbone fibre optic cable coast wide to provide high speed internet to about 156 communities. ## **Campfires Banned**

Effective at noon on Wednesday, July 18, 2018, all open burning (including campfires and Category 3 fires) are prohibited within the Coastal Fire Centre's jurisdiction [including Quadra, Cortes and the Discovery Islands].

The prohibitions will help prevent humancaused wildfires and protect public safety. **They will remain in effect until Oct. 19, 2018**, or until the public is otherwise notified. A map of the affected areas is available online at: http://ow.ly/j94230kZQgz

These prohibitions apply to all public and private land, unless specified otherwise.

### **Recycle More Flexible Plastic Packaging**

in Campbell River at Island Return-It

People in Campbell River can now recycle more flexible plastic packaging at Island Return-It.

New on the list of recyclables are:

- zipper lock pouches for frozen foods, grapes, dried fruits and grated cheese
- bags for potato chips and wrappers for snack bars
- net bags for avocados, onions and oranges
- bubble wrap and plastic air packets

"Flexible plastic is one of the fastest growing types of packaging in use, and Campbell River got in early on this expanded service by participating in the pilot project," says Drew Hadfield, the City's director of operations. "Expanding the recycling service helps increase the chance that this material ends up recycled rather than in the landfill."

The newly-accepted flexible plastic packaging often includes multiple layers of different types of plastic, making it more challenging to recycle. Collecting this new type of material is helping Recycle BC research and determine how to best recycle it, including turning it into engineered fuel.

The depot in Campbell River is one of the 117 stations from around BC participating in the pilot project. Recycle BC expects all depots begin collection of the material starting January 1, 2019.
