

### **Celebrating Jody Wilson-**Raybould, Independent

**THE WE WAI KAI NATION** is joining with the people of Vancouver Granville, British Columbians and all Canadians in celebrating Jody Wilson-Raybould's decision to run as an independent in this October's federal

"We know the skill, integrity and leadership qualities that Jody brings to Parliament and she will continue to serve the people of Vancouver Granville well," said Chief

Brian Assu. "We are pleased that she has made this decision. It speaks well of her commitment to making Canada and British Columbia a stronger place."

"There is great significance in Jody running as an independent and continuing to strive to build our country. Our own Nation's successes are realized more on consensus than on conflict and Jody has long been an advocate for principled public policy, open discussion, and transparency in decision making. Our Nation believes that the teachings Jody carries will continue to find their footing in Ottawa and that she and a few like-minded colleagues will leave an important mark on Canadian life," added Chief Assu.

"The We Wai Kai Nation, like all of Canada's First Nations, work with every level of government and politicians of all backgrounds. We know it is important that people like Jody Wilson-Raybould are drawn to public life," said Chief Assu. "Our members want the best people to seek office. We have a lot of work to do as Canadians and we believe that issues like climate change and the health of our oceans transcend the partisan stories that dominate the news."

Jody Wilson-Raybould served on the Council of the We Wai Kai Nation as well as being the Regional Chief for the BC Assembly of First Nations up until her nomination to run in Vancouver Granville in the last Federal Election. She maintains a home in the Cape Mudge Village and continues to be an important part of community life.

"In the end it is the young women and youth in our community who benefit the most. The commitment Jody is making and the work she will do representing the people of Vancouver Granville is something for them to look up to," stated Chief Assu.

### **Quadra Guests**

#### **BECAUSE QUADRA ISLAND**

is a community of unique and interesting individuals, it often plays host to visitors who are equally unique. Geshe YongDong Losar is such a person - a Tibetan monk who comes to Quadra a few times each year to teach and lecture in the Bon Buddhist tradition.

Born in a small village within the vast Tibetan Plateau, GesheLa lost his mother as a child of seven and was only ten years old when his family sent him to live and work with an uncle, herding yaks and sheep in the Himalayan mountains.

In 1981 he made the decision to become a monk and after eleven years of study was awarded the degree of Geshe (equivalent to a doctorate of religious studies). Because of the danger to monks and teachers in occupied Tibet, he escaped in 1992 by walking over the Himalayas to Kathmandu, Nepal. He then travelled to northern India where he met with the Dalai Lama, receiving additional teaching as well as instruction in the English language from His Holiness.

In 1999 Geshe YongDon traveled to Kitimat, BC at the invitation of a group of Bon Buddhists. Here he focused on learning about western culture as well as studying the English language. In 2003 he moved to Vancouver Island where he founded the Sherab Chamma Ling Tibetan Bon Buddhist Centre. In 2007 He became a Canadian citizen.

For twenty years this amazing man has been invited to teach in communities throughout the world and in 2014 began teaching over the internet as well.

Geshe YongDong will be on Quadra Island at the Stone House (253 Sutil Road) from 1 to 4 the afternoon of September 8th speaking on The Meaning of Healing.

### **Keeping Our Visitors Fire Smart!**

AS SPRING ROLLED INTO SUMMER, monthly meetings of the Sierra Quadra executive committee invariably began with musings of how another hot summer with record temperatures might impact our island. A few of us had encountered recent beach fires, some abandoned but still burning, others attended by visitors with no apparent plan as to how to proceed post-hot dog roast.

It was worrisome. Nearly a hundred years ago a wildfire near Stramberg Lake in Granite Bay - courtesy of a campfire started by government surveyors – swept down Hyacinthe Bay and Heriot Ridge on its way to Gowlland Harbour, and even sent a fireball over to Stag Island. Quathiaski Cove was spared only because two months of summer drought was broken by days of heavy rain.

Almost a century later, the month of June 2019 received the dubious distinction of achieving the hottest temperature in world history. So did July. June was also uncharacteristically dry: here on Quadra we received less than half the rainfall of the previous June.

These stats, combined with our recent experiences of stumbling upon out-of-season beach fires, prompted us to take action. We designed simple handouts to be distributed by BC Ferries in Campbell River to tourists coming over to Quadra. We then spent a couple of weeks in email exchanges with local reps of the Neighbourhood Emergency Preparedness Program (NEPP), the Quadra Fire Department, and the SRD Emergency Program. While the latter two expressed concerns about the potential waste of paper and to some extent even the need for this initiative, their feedback assisted us in refining our message.

We worked hard to get it right and to keep the footprint light. Each FireSmart handout is 4.25 by 5.5 inches, printed on standard yellow



paper. The text builds on the fireaware messaging on Island signs. in Island publications, and on BC

Ferries' announcements.

So why was it necessary to say it all again? Because not everyone hears announcements and – judging from the number of beach fires when and where there shouldn't be any - not everyone reads the signs by our firehalls and roadsides as they google their way around Quadra!

Fortunately BC Ferries in Campbell River was completely onboard with our proposal. This would not be happening without them - they were enthusiastic from the beginning, and assured us they'd only hand out cards to Ouadra visitors so as not to generate undue waste. (For the record, in our books they rock it!)

Four weeks in, the project seems to be having a positive impact. Locals are indeed not being inundated with paper waste, visitors are receiving the handouts along with their complimentary Ouadra maps. and the people we talked to are appreciative both of Sierra Quadra's efforts and BC Ferries' cooperation in helping to safeguard our beautiful island.

### **Re: Proposed Gowland Harbour Views**

I trust that all those of us who value the efforts of those whose time and wisdom went into the creation of our OCP will continue to enlighten Mr. Schellnick and re-establish the precedent set by those who recognise and appreciate the value of our very special community family and peaceful lifestyle.

I also hope we can influence others motivated by personal gain, to realize and share in the far greater value of what we have here and the responsibility to protect it.

I BELIEVE THIS PROPOSAL should be turned down. Quadra has an official community plan. It attempts to concentrate growth in a few nodes of development (eg: Q Cove, Heriot Bay, etc). Homes built well outside those nodes would have the opposite effect.

One of the arguments made in support of this proposal is that this land will be logged if it isn't developed. That's okay. We all use wood. Trees grow back. That's why the property is zoned for forestry in the Official Community Plan.

It sounds like there are two small parcels within the property that should be protected from logging. It would be great if that happened, whether through the generosity of the land owner or via a community effort to purchase and place covenants on those parcels. Perhaps they could even be turned into parks. Now that's a proposal I could support.



### REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT AUGUST 12, 2019

I hope you are all enjoying our quickly passing summer! I know I am trying to fit in as many things as I can in between Regional District and community duties. There is so much going on in all parts of Area C. I do try and write these reports to keep you filled in on what is going on, but I cannot possibly recount it all in a single issue of the Discovery Islander. Highlights are about all the DI can handle in each issue.

I am including the following reprint of a piece that I wrote in an earlier edition regarding the Independent Power Projects (Run of the River) in the Bute and Toba Inlet areas. I am providing it again with additional information because it is obvious that the Ministry saw fit to publish the proposal recently in the local newspapers for comment. This was supposed to be stopped by the Government, but it seems to be rolling along. Many more letters of opposition need to be written so please make this a priority. premier@gov.bc.ca

#### **Bute / Toba Inlet Independent** Power Project (IPP), deja vu!

I have received a referral from the Province via the SRD for a 4800+ hectare application to divert 17 river systems to produce power we do not need, that BC Hydro does not want, nor that is saleable to other states such as California due to their requirement to buy only "true" green power. IPP's are not! It requires complete destruction of miles and miles of wilderness areas and all of the things supported by that wilderness. The applicant is a Turkish company doing business as a numbered company out of Vancouver. The similar application was thrown out in 2011. All of the negative impacts are still the same, only worse now that we are in drought conditions that have effected river flows even more than anyone could have imagined 10 years ago. Our salmon are in peril; our fishers (of all types); our ecotourism companies will be severely impacted and to top it off they have not even referred the First Nations in whose territory all of this area is within.

I have written an eight page letter to the Premier, the Minister responsible and our MLA along with the referring agency solidly denouncing this proposed travesty to our environment and our community and First Nations. I am going to try and figure out how to make it into a link that can be accessed by all. I am including the file number for the application here: 2412171. 0024c9c265#details. Please, if you don't do anything else in the next days, please make this a priority. We put two years of energy into defeating it in 2009 / 2011 and it will effect all of you in the long run. The deadline approaches!

I will be working on setting up my Facebook account soon so that I will still have a page that I can post information so you can stay informed, but I will be setting it up so that

your replies will need to be sent by email or phone call. I have found that I am spending multiple hours every day of the week answering and discussing issues on FB and it is very difficult for me to record all of that info and be able to share it with the appropriate parties. This will be much more efficient and cut down on some of the tangential discussion that takes place. I am hoping that this proves to be a much better way for all of my constituents to keep in touch. Facebook is a very valuable tool for discussion, but limited for my use in dealing with other Directors and

#### **Integrated Community Sustainability Planning process**

This process is officially underway. The General Manager of Development Services and the consultant that was hired to lead the process, decided to post a link to the ICSP survey on the SRD website, which I am not at all pleased with. They developed the questions that would be asked without any consultation with me and as far as I am concerned they do not reflect the issues that we are facing at all. They have no relevance to the scope of the project and are very rudimentary. They do not address our OCP's, our bylaws, our Rural Land Use Bylaw for the outer islands, our vision, our infrastructure or any of the other important topics. I am told that the planners will just take this as a "first cut" and work with me to develop a more comprehensive list for community consultation and discussion. I look forward to that since that was the point of this entire exercise.

#### Cannabis discussion and consultation regarding possible bylaws

I would like to try and provide some clarification on the issue of the SRD regulating Retail sales / production of marijuana. The article in the Bird's Eye and my comments on Facebook seem to have confused the issue somewhat. First of all, I would like to note that the issue will be on our agenda this Wednesday. Don't panic! I will be referring it to our Integrated Community Sustainability Planning process for consideration and consultation with the public.

As a very, very quick background, the Feds have controlled licensing for years and recently changed that to sharing the responsibility with the Province, who in turn has downloaded some of that responsibility to Local Government.

This is the last thing in the world that I want to have to deal with! What people do on their private property has always been treated by me as their business as long as they are not breaking the law or infringing on their neighbours' rights. The land use regulation part for retail sales does fall under Local Government, like all other land uses, so the SRD is considering what to do about it. Why, you ask? Because (the gist of it) the Province has made it clear to the SRD and others that they will not issue licenses when applied for without word from local governments. They have said they will turn the applications down. Period. That would leave no way for people on Quadra to pursue this endeavour. We would need to explore instituting some sort of local bylaws so that we could respond to the Province and they could proceed with processing the applications. This would most likely not impact any existing operations.

The Area B Director initiated this discussion originally and the preparation of bylaws. After consideration of this, it seemed wise to follow suit and do the same for Quadra so as to not stifle creativity and the possibility of development of economic opportunity for islanders. So I asked that we consider creating bylaws for consultation with the public on this issue.

There was always every intention to consult fully with the community at large on this initiative. Staff need to be directed by the Board to do work and that includes creating bylaws for discussion. It would be premature to discuss anything before that point because the discussion would not be specific to the details of the topic. Having something in front of you for consideration makes sense. No decisions have been made yet, nor will they before the consultation takes place.

The community will have every opportunity that they want to discuss this and ultimately, if that is the direction taken, they will get to discuss it officially at a public hearing. If we do not have a bylaw of some sort, the consequence would be the risk of having valid applications ignored or turned down by the Province, eliminating the opportunities that might be possible. Keep that in mind. Also, I repeat, keep in mind that existing operations would most likely not be effected and grandfathered in.

That is why I voted to continue with the consideration and consultation. Note: Consideration and consultation! This is not a unilateral decision by your Director. It is a choice to try and do the best thing for islanders. Things are constantly changing around us with the Federal and Provincial governments and I have to try and keep

up with all of that. If this is the direction that we are expected to go and other local governments have already done it, then it is up to our staff to assess what others are doing and see what we can learn from them and their experience.

I would appreciate your thoughts by email, NOT Facebook, so I can share them easily with planners and other Directors. They are not on Facebook.

I realize that this is a difficult issue for everyone to deal with and I too do not want more regulation! I am looking for the best way to deal with this and I am sure that the creative minds on this island will help me do that. But, please, let's do it in a non-confromtational manner. You should all know that I was first elected on my stance that "we need more local control and more community involvement!". Over the years we have achieved that in so many ways. Let's not stop now.

I apologize for the misconceptions and misunderstandings that I may have caused or that the short article in the Bird's Eye may have caused.

#### Other issues

I appreciate all of the emails I have ben getting on the Gowlland Harbour Views proposal and encourage you to keep sending comments to me, but please insure that you send them to the SRD planners at anelson@srd.ca so they can be entered in the public record.


